#### OPERATION HIGHLIGHTS

#### **REGIONAL PHYSICAL AND FINANCIAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

Five (5) of the Special Area for Agricultural Development (SAAD) Program's priority provinces are located in the Eastern Visayas Region. Since the program's launch in 2016 and start of implementation in 2017, the Department of Agriculture (DA) and Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) regional offices in Region 8 have been faithful in delivering the purpose of SAAD.

The SAAD Program aims to alleviate poverty in the marginalized areas by providing the farmers and fishers with livelihood projects. For the agriculture sector, it provides projects related to livestock, poultry, high value crops, rice, and corn production. For the fisheries sector, the program delivers inputs to support the fishers in capture fishing, aquaculture, and post-harvest activities.

The DA has allotted a comparatively small budget, compared to other government programs, for its implementation in each province; Northern Samar, Eastern Samar and Samar Province starting 2017, expanding to Leyte and Southern Leyte in 2018.

**D**AAD implements the program in the regions through the Regional Program Management Support Office (RPMSO) and the Provincial Program Management Support Office (PPMSO). They are also in-charge in the operations, monitoring, and evaluation of the projects, reporting to the SAAD National Program Monitoring Office at the DA Central Office.

SAAD operation was made possible through partnerships with other government agencies, the local government units (LGU) and other private organizations. They were greatly involved in the selection of the beneficiaries, providing support during deliveries of inputs, up to the management of the livelihood projects.

For the SAAD implementers to determine the gaps in knowledge and practices of the beneficiaries, the selected farmers and fishers undergo needs assessment workshop before receiving the interventions. The program also conducts training, seminars, and workshops to equip farmers and fishers in the proper care and management of the livelihood projects. Moreover, the associations also attend values formation seminars to provide them proper mindset and promote cooperation between the members.

The program, after providing the livelihood projects and all necessary training, continuously assists the farmers and fishers group in building a community enterprise. Through the enterprises, the beneficiaries can produce enough supply of food, not only for subsistence, but also for the neighboring areas. They may also be sustainable sources of income, especially to the areas where food accessibility is a challenge.



DA-SAAD Region 8 has recorded nine existing enterprises as of July 2020. The enterprises are now selling assorted fresh vegetables, eggs, ducklings, piglets, and pig carcass.

Some of them produced processed products such as *balut* and leche flan, which can be sold at a higher price than the fresh produce. Furthermore, one association is now operating a mini agri-vet store.

L here is a perception among rural communities of biased treatment of the government towards them as compared to the well-offs in urban areas. We cannot blame this kind of thinking from the people who have been living in poverty for a very long time.

Some of these people left their communities with nothing much to hope for, often resulting in mass migration to the metropolis and nearby cities to try their luck and look for better opportunities.

With the birth of the SAAD Program in the province of Northern Samar, the sentiment towards the government was addressed through various projects aimed at empowering impoverished communities.

The SAAD Northern Samar team understood the realities of poverty and lack of food security in these communities; subsistence farming is a way of life for the rural folks. It is just a way to secure their food and nothing else.

With this knowledge, the current direction of the program is to organize the farmers into associations, equipping them with the required skills and mindset to prepare them, manage the livelihood projects given by SAAD and develop a sustainable communal enterprise.

The livelihood projects provided by SAAD were rice, corn, vegetable, poultry, and swine production-related projects which help jumpstart the beneficiary's economic status as additional sources of income.

The farmers had undergone various training under the Social Preparation Component such as values formation, leadership, and financial literacy training.

Since these farmers were usually only concerned with production, they did not think that farming can be a viable business venture; the marketing aspect is unfamiliar to them and this often results in significant losses.

Market identification and linkages must be planned ahead of time. Through educating these farmers of its importance, they can produce and supply consistent quality products in reasonable volumes for the buyers.

SAAD Program is a relatively new initiative and has a low budget allocation. Yet, with the

unwavering dedication of the SAAD team and various stakeholders, doubters came to realize its significance.

This year, the province has been a recipient of 17 livelihood projects amounting to Php 94,167,872.00 since 2016. The SAAD program has touched the lives of 7,153 individuals and 116 group beneficiaries.

There is still a long way to go, but the team is well aware of what's happening in the field. With unexpected distractions and detours as they go along, the team is poised to continue what they have started from day one.

Current direction of the program is to group the SAAD beneficiaries into organized associations; equip them with the required skills and mindset in preparation for their transition to become a group or communal enterprise. Before, the farmers were only concerned with production of their commodities, without thinking and planning about the marketing aspect. This often resulted in significant losses in revenues. This wrong practice must be put to stop by educating these groups on the importance of a ready market. Market identification and linkages are the main priorities that must be planned ahead of time. The SAAD Northern Samar team believes that quality products, volume, consistency of supplies, and ready market will define a better prospect for the beneficiaries.

The SAAD Program is not perfect, and not that big in terms of budget allocation. However, these shortcomings are addressed with the dedication of its personnel in the field. Volunteerism and own initiative augment these flaws and imperfections. The team admits its own share of blunders and failures, but they persevere. After all, as Paolo Coelho quipped in his famous book, The Alchemist, *"The secret of life, though, is to fall seven times and to get up eight times."* 

## NORTHERN SAMAR PROVINCIAL PROFILE Physical Profile

**N** orthern Samar is one of the three provinces in Samar Island. The province has a total land area of 3692,930 hectares (ha). Considered as a second-class province, it is composed of 24 municipalities and 569 barangays.

The region has a very rugged terrain with restricted plains and valleys. The river valleys are low-lying and often interrupted by hills. The interior of the mainland consists of highly dissected hills and mountain peaks. Low-lying hills are found between the coastal plains of Palapag, the river valley of Gamay, and the Catubig Valley.

The province is set near the breeding ground of typhoons. The Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) has recorded 48 typhoons from 1948 to 2009, or three times every two years.

Poverty Situation

N orthern Samar has been consistently included in the provinces with the highest poverty incidence among families along with Eastern Samar, Lanao del Sur, Maguindanao, Masbate, Sarangani, and Zamboanga del Norte in the years 2006, 2009, and 2012.

When the SAAD Program was launched in 2016, Northern Samar was one of the original provinces chosen as a beneficiary because of its average poverty incidence rate. In fact, it had the highest incidence rate among the three Samar provinces.

It has recorded a 43.5% poverty incidence among families in 2012 (PSA, 2015 Small Area Poverty Estimates). It is the only province in the region that has increased its poverty rate for the year 2015. It went from 43.5% in 2012 to 51.5% by 2015.

However, the province recorded its biggest decline in poverty incidence among families from 51.5% in 2015 to 27.4% in 2018. This was highlighted during the NEDA 8 Statement on the 2018 Full-Year Poverty Statistics of Eastern Visayas on January 31, 2020 in Tacloban City.

# Agricultural Profile

About 243,084 ha of the province's land are utilized for agricultural purposes.

Based on the 2018 data of PSA, coconut is the major crop of the province. It has produced a volume of 269,848 metric tons (MT) from a harvested area of 84,250 ha. This gives an average yield of 3.2 MT per ha. Following coconut as a major crop are rice, sweet potato, and banana.

The municipalities of Laoang and Las Navas have the highest volume of rice production, while San Vicente and Biri have the lowest. This is attributed to the presence of water resources, such as beaches and rivers, in lieu of agricultural lands. Most of the municipalities though have adequate areas for rice production. However, some are not blessed with such land resources.


For the poultry sector, native or improved chicken has the highest production in the province. The PSA recorded that the province has produced 100,105 chicken in 2019.

For the livestock sector, the province has the highest production of hogs, producing a total of 9,163 pigs in 2019.

armers who qualified after a thorough process of validation, verification, profiling, and geotagging were selected to receive project assistance. The recipients underwent the required training before the agri-inputs were delivered and distributed to them.

In 2017, 23 municipalities were chosen as project recipients. The budget was allocated for the implementation of projects in areas of rice and corn production enhancement, enhanced vegetable gardening, sustainable goat production, swine fattening, and enhanced chicken layer production.

The University of Eastern Philippines (UEP) was tapped as the training arm of the program. Farmers engaged in different projects were assiduously capacitated by experts in their respective fields of expertise to arm the former with knowledge and skills on improved technologies.

Only 13 local LGUs were chosen as beneficiaries in 2018. The farmers were provided with assistance in their respective endeavors, namely: rice and corn production, mallard duck and native chicken poultry production.

Needless to say, monitoring of projects continued since SAAD Program inception, to assist the farmers in their needs, facilitate in conveying their requirements to concerned offices, and for production data gathering.

During the year, the province was delisted from the list of 10 poorest provinces in the country largely because of the help of SAAD Program to poor farmers, as attested to by provincial government officials. Its far-reaching impact was instrumental in bringing down the poverty rate, as testimonies of the farmers would subsequently reveal.

For 2019, nine municipalities became recipients of interventions in areas of rice and corn production, enhanced vegetable gardening, native chicken poultry production, and sustainable goat production. Funding for corn and vegetable farmers was given more emphasis during the year.

As the program reached its midterm, the strategic focus has since shifted to helping groups develop themselves into becoming market-oriented, subsequently evolving into entrepreneurship.

Thus, in 2020, 13 farmers' associations have been assisted in four projects, including swine production, swine and mallard duck production, mallard duck production, and native chicken and vegetable production.

Field personnel actively pursue monitoring activities to encourage the beneficiaries to sustain the projects despite bottlenecks to project implementation, chiefly, the COVID-19 pandemic health crisis.

## NORTHERN SAMAR

Fishery Profile

**N** orthern Samar, with a coastline of 13,710.07 km and a total land area of 3,692.93 square kilometers, occupies the northern section of Samar Island in the Eastern Visayas region. The province is bounded on the north by the San Bernardino Strait, on the east by the Pacific Ocean, on the west by the Samar Sea, on the southwest by Samar Province, and on the southeast by Eastern Samar.


It is composed of 20 coastal municipalities with 221 coastal barangays and 22, 231 fisherfolk registered through the DA-BFAR Fisherfolk Registration System (FRS). It also has 1,731 registered fishing boats, of which 865 are motorized and 866 are non-motorized (BFAR).

Its major fishing grounds are the Samar Sea, San Bernardino Strait, and the Pacific Ocean. These fishing grounds serve as breeding places for various species like Spanish mackerel, grouper, tuna, big-eyed scad, herring, anchovies, salmon, round scad, and siganids. The province also has other marine resources that include crustaceans and mollusks, i.e. crabs, shrimp, squid, cuttlefish, lobster, and octopus.

#### FISHERY SECTOR

 $\mathbf{N}$  orthern Samar PLGU received the SAAD funds worth Php 15.127 million in 2017. Some of the projects implemented were *bangus* production in cage culture, seaweed production and provision of deep sea *payao* and other fishing paraphernalia.

In 2018, the budget amounting to Php 15 million was allotted for the distribution of various fishing gear and paraphernalia, aquaculture projects, village-level processing plant and equipment, as well as various project management and training.

Aquaculture interventions were given priority in 2019, which is the final year of the program's implementation in the province which was provided with a budget worth Php 12 million.

The interventions have been conducted and delivered by the Provincial Fishery Office of Northern Samar in active coordination with the provincial and municipal LGUs.

Through this team, identification of feasible areas for suitable livelihood intervention and qualified fisherfolk beneficiaries took place.

## Love for Family: THE STORY OF LOWER CAYNAGA RURAL IMPROVEMENT CLUB

Group: Lower Caynaga Rural Improvement Club (RIC)

Beneficiaries: **28** 

Location: Barangay Lower Caynaga, Lope de Vega, Northern Samar

Projects: FY 2019 Enhanced Corn Production Project FY 2020 Native Chicken & Vegetable Production Project



## BACKGROUND

Lope de Vega is a 4th class municipality in the 1st district of Northern Samar.

According to the 2015 census, it has a population of 14,687 people. Its local economy heavily relied on the agriculture industry, specifically coconut, abaca, root crops, and vegetable production. It is considered one of the poorest municipalities in Northern Samar alongside Silvino Lubos.

Lower Caynaga is one of the barangays of Lope de Vega. Known for its tropical rainforest climate type, it has a very short dry season and rainfall is normally heavy throughout the year. Flooding is also a common occurrence, especially during the "amihan" seasons. High poverty is also prevalent due to limited livelihood and employment opportunities.

In 2019, Lower Caynaga was selected by the Municipal Agriculture Office (MAO) as one of the top priority barangays for the SAAD.

Driven by the desire to help their families increase their meager incomes, some mothers organized themselves to form a group, called Lower Caynaga Rural Improvement Club (RIC). It was registered with the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) on August 5, 2019 to comply with the requirements of the SAAD Program. The club started with 30 members but was reduced to 28 a few months later.

The club is composed of housewives, who are either primary or secondary undergraduates, who typically assist their respective husbands in farm-related activities such as copra production as well as vegetable and root crops cultivation. Others raised backyard swine and native chicken to augment the family income.

## PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION

L he MAO paved the way to the group's inclusion in several livelihood projects both at the municipal and regional levels.

In 2019, the club received a power tiller worth Php 250,000.00 and 24 kg sweet corn seeds amounting to Php 43,200.00 under the 2019 Enhanced Corn Production Project of the SAAD Program.

In 2020, the group is set to receive several agricultural inputs under the Native Chicken & Vegetable Production Project, which include ready-to-lay chicken, layer mash, polynet green, drugs and biologics, assorted vegetable seeds, fertilizers, UV Film, and farm tools amounting to Php 594,380.00. However, due to the COVID-19 crisis, procurement and delivery were delayed several times.

A technical training on Native Chicken & Vegetable Production was also conducted for the group members in February 2020.

## PROJECT Management

L he group has a ½-ha communal vegetable garden located in two areas within the barangay. They are planted with vegetables such as ampalaya, squash, eggplant, okra, bell pepper, tomato, and sweet corn.

The communal gardens are managed and maintained by all of its members. The day-to-day operations of each site were made possible by dividing the group into two clusters. Each has an assigned site and a designated team leader, who delegates farm chores among members. Record-keeping is also done separately in each site and then consolidated regularly.

With the imposition of the Enhanced Community Quarantine (ECQ) as a safety protocol to fight the COVID-19, most members of the association lost their livelihood due to restricted movements. The Typhoon Ambo in May 2020 also brought flooding in most villages in Lope de Vega, including Barangay Lower Caynaga.

Their love for family, determination, and hard work made them overcome the obstacles. With the uncertainties of the future, no weapon is more potent than ample preparation and sound contingency plans.

Among the measures that the club adopted were cropping calendar to avoid heavy losses during typhoon months, diversification of income-generating projects and not depend solely on vegetable production, an emergency fund that can be loaned by its members in time of needs, and cultivation of short-term cash crops such baby corn & bitter gourd for efficient cash flow.

## **KEY RESULTS**

Т

L he group earned a decent income from their initial foray into vegetable gardening. Had it not been for the damage brought to their crops by the typhoon, they projected a much bigger revenue.

Records provided by Municipal Agriculturist Myra B. Lim of Lope de Vega LGU showed that the group generated an income of Php 36,954.00 from sales of 707 kg assorted vegetables from April to May 2020.

The amount they earned from vegetable production was invested as an emergency fund, which can be borrowed or loaned by members with a minimum monthly interest of 5%.

The club markets their vegetable produce through stalls placed at strategic locations within the town. The majority of their clients walk-in buyers.

## PLANS

L he group is also looking at the possibility of buying some piglets to be distributed to members for fattening or breeding. To sustain the business venture, a rollover scheme will be implemented, with a portion of the income going back to the group's coffers.

Once the production cycle is over by August 2020, the vegetable garden will be replaced with sweet corn to be provided by the SAAD Program.

Lower Caynaga RIC already started planting their sweet corn seeds August 1, 2020 in a 200 square meters lot in their communal garden. It is expected to harvest 2,000 ears which will be sold at Php 100.00/8pcs with a total gross sale of Php 25,000.00. No expenses will be incurred since labor and manpower were provided by the members. Also. There were no fertilizers or insecticides applied to the crop.

With the delivery of SAAD inputs within the quarter, the group plans to expand the size of its communal vegetable garden in anticipation of a much bigger volume of agri-inputs.

A communal area for the upcoming Native Chicken Production is also being prepared for operation.



## **Bangus fish caging:** BRINGING FORTH HOPE & BUILDING RESILIENCY

Location: Barangay Aguadahan, San Jose, Northern Samar

## BACKGROUND

**S**an Jose's total land area of 2,985 ha (7,380 acres) is generally underlain by well-bedded and moderately undulating terrain. The rock unit is probably part of the Mawo Volcanics, which is widespread in Northern Samar

Being a coastal town, it has several islets within its municipal waters off its northern coast. They are bountiful in fish, crustaceans, and other marine products.

Living at the coastal barangay of Aguadahan, San Jose in Northern Samar, a fisherman who has experienced his fair share of storms is one of the beneficiaries of the 2017 Bangus Culture in Cage Project under the SAAD Program.

Mr. Alfredo Puazo had contended with raging winds and huge swells of many typhoons. As a small fisher, he would lose most of the time – bringing irreparable damages to his livelihood.

One of the most destructive typhoons he had encountered was the Typhoon Tisoy or Kammuri in 2009. A single parent to four children, the crisis brought him difficulties to provide for his family.

Life is indeed terrible for poor fishers like him but, he chose to rise and be resilient every single day. His determination to rebuild what was lost and the desire to stand up and move on engraved the heart and mind of Mr. Puazo.

He didn't see his status as a disadvantage and instead took it as an opportunity. Just as he thought he reached rock bottom, the SAAD Program intervened and slowly improved the living condition of his family. Truly, when a person is at his lowest point in life, there is nowhere to go but up.

## PROJECT Implementation

Fishing has always been the livelihood of Mr. Puazo. When he was selected to be one of the beneficiaries of the SAAD Program in 2017, he received an HDPE (High Density Polyethylene) fish cage worth Php 170,000.00 for *bangus* culture.

To commence the operation of the Bangus fish cage project, SAAD provided 185 bags of feeds from the 2017 funds and 5,000 fingerlings under 2018 for his first cropping.

To further support and sustain his livelihood, he received another 175 bags of bangus feeds in 2019.

## PROJECT MANAGEMENT AND RESULTS

#### T

L he fish cage of Mr. Puazo fully operated in 2018 after the provision of bangus fingerlings and feeds. Continuous monitoring and provision of technical assistance by experts from PFO - Northern Samar ensured a bountiful harvest.

Mr. Puazo also attended a training on Bangus Fish Cage Culture in 2018. Acquired knowledge helped him in the day to day operation of his fish cage.

Through his relentless efforts, he was able to harvest a total of 1,500 kg of milkfish in 2018. They were sold to local markets and buyers with an earning of Php 195,000.00.

From the earnings, he allotted funds to purchase 5,000 fingerlings in the last quarter of 2018. After three months of culture and hard work, he harvested a total of 1,575 kg of bangus on January 11, 2019 and earned Php 204,750.00.

His income from his first and second production enabled him to buy a motorcycle, which his family uses for transportation. He was also able to build a kitchen for his home through the extra profit he obtained from the venture.

The aquaculture venture proved to be a profitable livelihood; thus, Mr. Puazo once again bought 5,000 fingerlings for the third cropping. A partial bangus harvest of 600 kg was obtained on October 28, 2019.

Due to a lack of buyers, Mr. Puazo opted to conduct a partial harvest to avoid post-harvest losses. On November 3, 2019 he conducted a total harvest of the remaining bangus due to an increase in demand. The harvest amassed a total of 900 kg of bangus and gained him an additional Php 117,000.00. Totaling both harvests, his income for the third cropping totaled to Php 195,000.00.

# PLANS

"So plano ko talaga pagmalakadamo, kay syempre naimud ko nga magincome siya. Kaya man niya magincome nga sapat man sako pamilya so karuyag ko ito nga mag-umento pa." (I plan to expand the production of my cages because I have observed that the venture provides a suitable income that is enough for the needs of my family, so with that, expanding the business is my goal.)

Mr. Puazo stated his desire to expand his business and continue with the third batch for his fish cage. Further, he said that once fingerlings are available in the locality, he plans to buy more to sustain his livelihood.

At present, he is searching for potential sources of additional capital for the development of his fish cages. He is also eyeing the lobster industry for he has experience in selling the high-valued commodity.

"Naghinga-upay gihapon an amon kamutangan, di man sugad pa ka okay pero nakabulig man siya." ("Our situation has improved, although we are still struggling, the program has certainly helped us.") Mr. Puazo expressed his faith as he eyes a brighter future for him and his children through the aquaculture industry.

#### Cont.

As Mr. Puazo's fish cages steadily provide him enough income for the needs of his family, he is now focusing on aquaculture instead of his past fishing ventures to the sea - where income has always been low and uncertain.

Gone were the days when he would spend the whole day in the middle of the sea, waiting for fish to be caught in his nets, days when the odds of bringing home food or earning an income enough for his family's day to day needs were slim to none, nights when sleep was a reprieve from the reality that he would again face in the morning, and food on the table would be scarce.

"Dako an amon pagpasalamat sa SAAD kay dako an kabuligan ton sa amo kay bukod sa naibanan ak pagpakadto sa dagat kay yaon na ak gnfofocusan an pagtubong sa mga bangus. Diri na sugaron nga parehos sa dati nga adto talaga ak sa kalalawdan." (We are thankful to the SAAD program for its help because other than spending lesser time on distant fishing, I can now focus on feeding the milkfish [managing the fish cages]. Unlike before when I really have to go fishing offshore.)

Mr. Puazo expressed his gratitude to the program as it not only gave him a livelihood but also time to spend with his children.

#### SAADventures

Most of the Eastern Samar residents are engaged in farming. For some of them, they acquire their income solely from farming and they are often branded as poor.

But with enough assistance and training, these marginal farmers can turn their small–scale farming into something sustainable that will surely upgrade their way of living.

It was in 2016 when the light and new hope shone their way. The government came up with the SAAD Program which aims to contribute to poverty reduction through the provision of agriculture–related interventions.

The province has been a beneficiary of various SAAD projects benefiting 7,946 individuals and 310 groups of farmers through a package of interventions provided to them.

The recipients of crop-related projects were given seeds, fertilizers, farm tools and small-value pre– and post-production equipment. For the livestock and poultry production, the farmers received animals, feeds, drugs and biologics, and forage planting materials. The beneficiaries were also trained on crop, livestock, and poultry production.

One of the challenges faced by the SAAD Eastern Samar during the early stage of the program was dealing with the traditional mindset of farmers. Most of them were hesitant to try new technologies and techniques introduced to them.

With the team's perseverance, patience, and dedication, this attitude was transformed. Aside from the training on production, SAAD also conducted value reformation seminars, leadership, and financial literacy training to equip them with adequate behavioral skills to sustain their projects and become successful.

These farmers are envisioned to become one of the province's known agri–entrepreneurs who will cater to the needs of the constituents through their agricultural produce.

There is no shortcut to success, so they say. Trials will always be on the way. It is just a matter of perseverance and determination to be able to attain one's goal.

There may be more challenges to come, but the team will persist in doing its best to achieve the pinnacle of success. The team will leave no stone unturned until the aim of the project is fully accomplished.



## EASTERN SAMAR PROVINCIAL PROFILE Physical Profile

Dastern Samar is one of the three provinces in Samar Island, Eastern Visayas Region. It is bounded on the east by the Pacific Ocean and the Philippine Sea; to its north is the province of Northern Samar; to the west is Samar Province; and Leyte Gulf lies to its south.

It is subdivided into 22 municipalities and one city; twenty of these are located along the coasts, while two are inland municipalities.

Its provincial capital, Borongan City, is approximately 550 air-kilometers southeast of Manila, and around 65 air kilometers northeast of its regional capital, which is Tacloban City.

Eastern Samar has a total land area of 461,720 ha. Roughly 237,785 ha, or 51.5% or of its total land area, are classified as agricultural land.

The entire area of the province is rough, hilly covered with dense tropical vegetation. Since the province faces the Pacific Ocean, it is regularly hit by powerful tropical cyclones such as Typhoon Haiyan.

# Poverty Situation

**D** ue to its easternmost location, which is adjacent to the Pacific Ocean, the province is frequently visited by tropical depressions that wreak havoc and devastation to crops and the livelihood of farmers.

The province ranked second among the 10 poorest in 2012, and 12th among the 30 poorest provinces in 2015 according to PSA.

The province of Eastern Samar registered a poverty incidence of 55.4% among families in 2012, decreasing to 37.4% in 2015.

The poverty incidence rate recorded last 2015 was the lowest rate the province had since 2006; there has been an 18% decrease in the incidence rate in 2015 data compared to the 2012 data of PSA.

## T.

he province's economy is dominated by agriculture and fishing, which are considered low-income generating activities.

Agricultural Profile

A total of 237,785 ha in the province is devoted to agriculture. About 95% of the total agricultural land (225,896 ha) are croplands. It is composed mostly of commercial crops such as coconut, abaca, banana, and pineapple. About 56,474 ha are intended for food crops such as root crops and palay.

Based on the PSA 2018 data, rice is the major crop produced in Eastern Samar. It has a total production volume of 59,588 MT/ha for a harvested area of 22,496 ha, giving an average yield of 2.65 MT per hectare.

Following rice as a major crop (rainfed and irrigated palay) are cassava and sweet potato.

Native or improved chicken has the highest volume of production in the province for the poultry sector, while swine has the highest volume for the livestock sector. According to PSA records, 111,668 chicken and 19,210 hogs were produced in 2019.

## AGRICULTURE SECTOR

In 2017, the projects were in the areas of rice and corn production enhancement, enhanced vegetable gardening–cum–techno demo, sustainable goat production, enhanced poultry production (layer and native chicken), and swine fattening.

The budget was appropriated for the establishment of the aforementioned projects, which benefited 2,935 individuals and 135 groups. Two hundred thirty-one (231) barangays in 10 municipalities were provided with interventions.

Beneficiaries underwent a thorough vetting process before they were benchmarked; thence, the delivery of project assistance to them. They likewise underwent the required training before the distribution of agri–inputs.

SAAD Program forged a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Eastern Samar State University (ESSU), where the latter was tasked to conduct all capacity enhancement training of farmers to aid in their farm activities. The PPMSO also requested the assistance of technicians of feed suppliers in the conduct of livestock training and workshops.

There were 75 villages in 21 municipalities that were provided with enabling projects in 2018. A total of 206 individual farmers and one group were supported by the program and received projects in rice, corn, swine, and poultry (mallard duck) production.

A non-traditional project, abaca production, was provided to reinvigorate the abaca industry in Eastern Samar that was devastated by successive typhoons in the near past. About 196,000 suckers were planted in the Municipalities of Dolores, Oras, Gen. MacArthur, and Arteche, but the average rate of plant survival was only 32%. Reasons for the low survival rate were damage due to the drought; improper handling during delivery; and damage due to flood 2 days after delivery. A total of 490 abaca farmers in 28 barangays of aforesaid localities were benefited from the project.

In 2019, 70 barangays in 11 municipalities were provided with livelihood assistance. They were in the areas of rice and poultry (native chicken) production, benefiting 400 individual farmers and 7 farmers' associations. The abaca production project was established in 38 barangays in Taft, Maslog, Can–avid, Jipapad, and San Policarpo, benefiting 610 abaca farmers.

Sixteen (16) barangays in five municipalities were the areas covered by the program in 2020. The focus of providing assistance has been modified from individual beneficiaries to groups starting in 2020; hence, this year, 17 farmers' associations received livelihood interventions. They involved production projects in sweet corn, vegetable, swine, poultry, *kalamansi*, and integrated poultry and *kalamansi*.

The PPMSO staff tirelessly monitor the progress of the projects and facilitate in addressing issues/problems besetting the recipient organizations. They help convey their concerns to program management and to whomever they deem could best answer the farmers' needs. No matter the dangers posed by the COVID-19 health emergency, they do not deter the staff from doing what is necessary for pursuing the goals of the SAAD Program.

**C** astern Samar has a total land area of 466,047 ha with one coastal city, 20 coastal municipalities, and two inland municipalities. Its entire east coast faces the Philippine Sea that forms part of the Pacific Ocean, evidently showing its economic dominance in fisheries and agriculture.

Fishery Profile

It has recorded 33, 588 registered fisherfolk (27,350 males and 6,238 females). They often fish at Leyte Gulf and Matarinao Bay using motorized and non-motorized fishing boats of which 3,507 and 2,202 are registered respectively.

Other than Tilapia, Bangus and Grouper culture, the province is also a major producer of seaweeds in the region with an average annual production of 95,260 kg fresh and 1,300 kg dried.



## FISHERY SECTOR

L he BFAR-SAAD Program in the province started its implementation in 2017 and ended in 2019. During its initial year, SAAD transferred the budget to the PLGU.

Further, the said office and the Provincial Fisheries Office of Eastern Samar collaborated in the validation of the target beneficiaries and identification of feasible livelihood interventions. The PLGU did the procurement and implementation of the interventions.

Recipients of these interventions have undergone relevant technical training for capability enhancement. SAAD provides livelihood packages to the 23 municipalities of the province throughout its three years of implementation.



## BACKGROUND

 ${f B}$ ayobay is a barangay in the 4th class city of Borongan in Eastern Samar. It has 150 households as residents. The majority of them depends on farming, selling nipa shingles, and working as laborers. Despite hard work, their meager income cannot sustain their daily needs nor can cope up with lifestyles enjoyed by middle-class families.

Bayobay SAAD Livestock and Vegetable Production Association (BSLAVPA) is a small group of people in the barangay which works together to help each other enhance their household income. It was organized in May 2018 and registered in DOLE on March 5, 2019.

Mr. Romeo Plata leads the group with 32 members, all belonging to the marginalized sector of society, and earn an average monthly household income of Php 3,207.00.

### PROJECT Implementation

n 2018, group members were selected for the Swine Production Projectamounting to Php 1,112,995.00 while 20 other members received the Mallard Duck Production Project amounting to Php 288,000.00.

Upon implementation of the program, the farmers were provided with a three-day intensive and hands-on training on the production and management of swine and mallard ducks.

On May 24, 2018, 22 selected beneficiaries each received one head swine with eight bags of feeds. In December 2018, 20 other beneficiaries received six (6) mallard ducks with two bags of feeds.

To establish a communal area to rear the swine, the members voluntarily contributed an amount that reached up to Php 24,535.00.

They also created policies which include that every individual beneficiary of gilt must share two piglets- one for a member and another one for the association.

Another policy was also imposed for beneficiaries of mallard duck production. Upon production of ducklings, beneficiaries must share three birds to the association (one male and two females) to generate shared capital.

In October 2019, the members also received 480 layer chicken, egg-laying machines, and 100 bags of feeds amounting to Php 644,000.00.

### PROJECT MANAGEMENT

 ${f E}$  very beneficiary of the group is required to have an investment in the form of piglets and mallard ducklings.

With the policy in force, the association collected 9 piglets with 13 more to follow. Seven of the piglets were converted into fattened swine and eventually sold in the local market while two piglets were converted into gilts for production.

Meanwhile, the share capital of members for mallard ducklings still needs to be collected as the establishment of a shade house is ongoing.

For the management of layer chicken for egg production, the group formed 7 groups - each having a weekly schedule to attend to at round-the-clock duty. They also buy succeeding feeds from funds earned from sales.

Regular monthly meetings to discuss financial statements, liquidation, among other things are conducted by the association every last Sunday of the month. After every meeting, the members engage in *pintakasi* or *bayanihan* to further develop the communal area.

The group also opened a savings bank account intended for the association's future expansion. Monitoring of the project is constantly done by members of the association, DA-SAAD staff, and LGU.

All animals provided by the program were insured with PCIC, making the project less vulnerable in times of calamities.

m ith}$  combined hard work, dedication, and determination, the association is happy as members already benefited from their first profit sharing.

In December 2019, the association decided to divide the amount of Php 35,000.00 equally to its members. The fund was taken out from their net income worth Php 87,000.00.

Another profit sharing had also taken place in June 2020 with Php 68,000.00 equally divided among members.

#### Income on egg production

Currently, the association's main product is eggs. Since the start of its chicken production, it has produced 88,252 eggs.

During the COVID-19 pandemic (March to June), the group was able to sell 40,260 eggs, which helped in the food supply of the local community. Members also sold eggs at a price of Php 195.00 per tray.

It was observed that October 2019 had the lowest production record since it was the first month of project implementation.

April 2020 also had low production because the layer chickens entered into the molting stage, thereby affecting their capacity to produce eggs.

The association had total sales of Php 525,166.00 for its nine months of project operations, but it had also recorded total operational expenses of Php 418,140.00.

The said amount for operating expenses was used in buying feeds, lrugs, and biologics, ince the allocated feeds viven to them was only good for three months.

Other expenses include the purchase of office

supplies, lot rental, payment of water and electricity bills, and labor wages. Funds that they used in profit sharing were subsumed in the expense item.

#### Income on swine fattening

The source of piglets for the swine fattening and production is from the shared investments of individual beneficiaries from the 2018 Swine Production Project. Once received, the association took care of the pigs until they became marketable.

The association will receive 22 piglets in 2020.

As of July 2020, 9 members already gave piglets while 13 are yet to give their share. Out of 9 piglets received, 7 were converted into swine fattening and eventually sold in the amount of Php 57,000.00 at an average price of Php 8,142.00 per head.

The remaining piglets were converted into gilts intended for swine production. A total of Php 48,144.00 was recorded as expenses in the project operations.

Presently, the association has Php 123,177.06 total savings in its bank account and Php 20,272.00 cash on-hand. Its savings will be used as a rolling fund for the sustainability of the association projects.

Furthermore, the association has started expanding its projects, specifically the Layer Chicken Production, which had bred and produced 27 chicks.

he association is grateful enough having acknowledged what the DA–SAAD has done to twist their life around  $360^{\circ}$ , through improving their means of livelihood.

"Malaki po ang pasasalamat namin sa SAAD Program dahil kung wala po ito, mananatili po kaming nahihirapan sa paghahanap ng dagdag pagkakakitaan, lalo na ngayon na may pandemya," said the association president during the interview.

(We are deeply grateful to SAAD Program because if not for it, we would still have a hard time looking for an alternative source of income, especially at this time of the pandemic.)

Members of the association have invested time and effort to ensure the imminent success of their projects, and have high expectations of attaining it. Regarding sustainability, they laid out their plans as follows:

- 1. Purchase of land, which will be owned by the association;
- 2. Expansion of existing projects through breeding;
- 3. Supplier of layer chicken and swine; and
- 4. Establishment of a learning site and farm school.

With these vision and goals, the association needs to undergo training on entrepreneurship and development, bookkeeping, and management.

## BACKGROUND

**L** astern Samar is declared as one of the poorest provinces in the country; forming a percentage of the less fortunate of its population are the fishers.

The coastal municipality of San Julian boasts a rich and vibrant marine ecosystem that is the main source of livelihood of registered fisherfolk in the municipality. Furthermore, as the municipality faces the Pacific Ocean, deep sea fishing is a popular way of capturing the bounties of the seas amongst the locals.

A risky yet a good-yielding fishing venture, the area is famous for its sumptuous tuna that is usually caught from a day's hard voyage at sea. With its good water quality, the area is also ideal for the culture of marine species that can serve as a profitable aquaculture venture for the fisherfolk in the area.

To provide a helping hand to the countryside heroes, the SAAD Program initiated the implementation of numerous aquaculture and capture projects geared to support and provide its beneficiaries with sustainable livelihood programs that will empower them into the strong and prosperous fishermen that they should be.

Mr. Diosdado Cristo, also called as Mano Baoy, was born and raised believing that the sea is generous with its rich and vibrant resources as it is also daunting. He also believes that being a fisherman is one of the noblest professions.

True enough, within their hands lies the great responsibility of ensuring the basic survival of a nation and like other frontliners in the war against the COVID-19 pandemic, they continually risk their lives just to ensure the availability of nutritious food on many Filipino families' tables.

Fishers work from dusk till dawn and bravely soar the wild seas to deliver their fresh catch. However, unlike other professions, stability is not given in their work as it is oftentimes life-threatening.

Mr. Cristo has seen the different faces of the sea and while he knows the risk, he believes that the blue waters are his greener pastures. He has worked tirelessly his whole life and through his deep-sea voyages, he has managed to provide a good life for his family and sent his eight children to school. Six are college graduates and professionals in their respective fields while his remaining two children are still studying.

His love for the fisheries sector must have made a great impression on his children because the two ended up studying it as a way of giving back to the industry that has nurtured them.

Inevitably, the bravery and perseverance of Mr. Cristo also inspired the fisherfolk in his locality to be strong like him, seeing the profession not just as a way to sustain their daily needs but as an entrepreneurial venture benefitting not only them but also their communities. Soon enough, fishers in San Julian elected Mano Baoy to be the president of Competent Agri-Marine Beneficiary Adopt Technology of New Generation (CAMBATONG) Fisherfolk Association.

Seeing the confidence, courage, and leadership that Mr. Cristo exhibited, he was selected to be one of the beneficiaries of the SAAD project in the province, further serving as a means to improve the dire situation of the fisherfolk in his locality.

### PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION

M anong Baoy was given two (2) units of *payao*, also called Fish Attracting Device of FADs, during the 2017 implementation of the SAAD Program under its Capture Component.

Moreover, the association was given a 30-footer fiberglass-reinforced boat with a 16 HP motor engine, 50 units of hook and line for their individual members, and *pangkabuhayan* package inclusive of fish processing materials, and materials for the installation of pearls nursery cage in 2018.

The following year, the PFO Eastern Samar through the SAAD Program granted them materials for the construction of a fish cage so they could go into aquaculture and somehow lessen the fishing pressure. About 5,000 milkfish fingerlings were stocked and 185 sacks of feeds were provided under the aquaculture program of SAAD for the continuity of the project.

## PROJECT MANAGEMENT

According to Manong Baoy, they set out for their *payaos* four times a week. Their catch is usually an assortment of yellowfin tuna, skipjack tuna, dolphin fish, round scad tuna, and blue marlin.

For their bangus culture, Manong Baoy lets the members of the association help out in the maintenance, daily operation, and the overall monitoring of the cages. Mobilizing his members is not an easy job but he motivates them by providing additional incentives to those who are willing to assist in the operation.

Even without incentive, Manong Baoy observed that some of his members willingly helped out both in their *payao* fishing and *bangus* fish caging as they know the importance of hard work, unity, and cooperation in sustaining their livelihood projects.

"Dako it ak pagtapod nga ha sustainability hini magkakamayda hin kaupayan iton kada miyembro namon," Mr. Cristo said.

(I have high faith that through the project's sustainability, each member could expect great things to happen in the future.)

Lastly, Mr. Cristo declared that with the SAAD's thrust towards sustainability coupled with the members' commitment and intent towards the project, then it is just a matter of time before they become successful entrepreneurs.

## **KEY RESULTS**

**E** arnings from a single fishing trip have always ranged from a minimum of Php 5,000.00 to Php 10,000.00 which he divides for the members who joined the trip while also allotting a portion for their association funds.

Meanwhile, they were able to harvest 1,350 kg of bangus from May 5 to 6, 2020 which they sold locally at Php 180.00 per kilo. They earned a total of Php 243,000.00.

The fund is currently in the association's savings account. Deducted from it are the incentives for the members who helped in the preparation of the fish cage and for the caretakers who took charge of the maintenance, monitoring, and other daily operational needs during the four-month culture period.

With the proceeds coming from both their fish cage and *payaos*, they expect higher dividends to be distributed among the members at the end of 2020.

# PLANS

At present, Mr. Cristo and the association members are in the process of preparing their fish cage for the second cropping with fingerlings from the provincial government of Eastern Samar.

He also plans to hold a general assembly so he can inform the members of his proposals for the expansion and development of their aquaculture and capture fisheries ventures.

He will propose an additional fish cage to be installed near their first one. Further, he will also suggest the procurement of new motorboats to be used in their *payao* operations and to enable more members to help.

Both proposals will be financed by their income from their first harvest. All plans will be laid out and discussed during their assembly.

"Diri kamo namon bibiguon hini nga iyo naihatag hiton amon association. Padayon ini namon pagtatalingohaon nga mapalago ngan mapadamo ini nga amon mga proyekto nga nakarawat ha iyo." (We will not fail you. We will exert our best efforts into growing and developing these projects we have received from you.)

Mr. Cristo promised that the trust given to them will not be wasted and they will work to be a progressive fisherfolk community.

The SAAD Samar team has big hopes for all the program participants, aiming for the farmers to develop a sustainable enterprise. There may be hurdles encountered on the field, but the team persists to give opportunities to Samareños, always ready to assist them in their endeavor.

Provincial Coordinator Kristine Dorothea T. Danago summed it all up by saying, "In everything you do, put your heart into it; then you can feel the struggles, hopes, and dreams of many. Be an inspiration to others by being inspired. Have positivity in everything."

## **SAMAR PROVINCIAL PROFILE** *Physical Profile*

T he province of Samar (formerly known as Western Samar) occupies the southwestern part of the Samar island. It has the largest area of 571,155 ha compared to the other two provinces. It constitutes 42% of the island's total land area and 26% of Region 8.

Samar has two cities and 24 municipalities and is divided into two districts with Catbalogan as its provincial capital.

 $\mathbf{S}_{\mathsf{amar}}$  is included in the list of the poorest provinces with 43.5% poverty incidence among families in 2012. However, it has decreased to 39.5% in 2015.

Poverty Situation

In 2015, the island Municipality of Daram had the highest poverty incidence rate at 52.7, while expectedly the province's capital, Catbalogan City, which is relatively prosperous being the center of commerce and education, had the lowest rate at 17.9%.

# Agricultural Profile

Samar is described as hilly and mountainous. Due to deforestation and *"kaingin,"* slopes are generally steep and bare of trees. Run-off rainwater on these slopes can provoke flooding in lowland areas. Topsoil is carried to the sea, creating hydrosols and enlarging mudflats and mangrove areas. The erosion of mountain areas enlarges the coastal plains of Samar.

The people of Western Samar rely on the following agri and fishery-related livelihood industries:

- 1. Integrated Mussel Industry (Calbayog);
- 2. Coco Oil Industry (Calbayog);
- 3. Tinapa Industry (Calbayog);
- 4. Native Cheese Processing (Gandara);
- 5. Abaca Industry;
- 6. Ticog Industry (Basey);
- 7. Fishing Industry; and
- 8. Copra Industry

The total agricultural land in the province constitutes about 18% (101,954 ha) of its total land area. Samar is rich in crops. Based on the Department of Agriculture (DA) – Adaptation and Mitigation Initiative on Agriculture's (AMIA) Farmers' Guide Map, crops suitable for the province are abaca, banana, cacao, cassava, coconut, corn, legumes, oil palm, papaya, pineapple, rice, rubber, sugarcane, sweet potato, taro, vegetables, and yam.

However, the champion commodity in the province is coconut and rice. The total volume of production for rice in 2018 is 151,567 MT, while for coconut, the total volume of production is 272,617 MT.

In poultry, the native (improved) chicken has the highest volume of production in the province; swine has the highest volume of production for livestock. PSA has recorded the production of 334,248 chicken and 38,806 swine in 2019.

#### AGRICULTURE SECTOR

Damar Province completes the three provinces in Region 8 along with Northern and Eastern Samar that were chosen as beneficiaries of the SAAD Program when it was formally launched in 2016 for the 2017 implementation.

All 24 municipalities and 2 cities were covered by the program, where 260 barangays were included in the list of areas provided with agricultural interventions.

The farmers who qualified as beneficiaries underwent a thorough process of validation, verification, profiling, and geotagging before receiving project assistance.

They had gone through the required training before the agri-inputs were delivered and distributed to them.

In 2017, the budget allocated for the implementation of the projects were on rice and corn production enhancement, enhanced vegetable gardening-cum-techno demo, sustainable goat production, enhanced poultry production (layer and native chicken), swine fattening, and non-traditional projects that involve the cultivation of crops indigenous to Samar Province: peanut, ginger, and *ube*.

4,750 individual farmers and 161 farmers' associations situated in 150 barangays in all 24 municipalities and 2 cities of Samar were benefited.

The PPMSO tapped Agricultural Technologists of the Office of the Provincial Agriculturist and technicians of feed suppliers to act as Resource Persons during training/workshops. Oftentimes, the staff themselves served as lecturers when the invited speakers were not available.

Four (4) projects were implemented in 2018, benefiting 388 individual farmers and one group. These were in the areas of corn production, swine production, poultry production (mallard duck), and ube production. The projects covered 19 barangays in 7 municipalities.

The 2019 implemented projects that were located in 23 barangays in 11 municipalities of Samar were in the production of poultry (mallard duck), goat, corn, vegetable, and non-traditional crops that are native to the province: pineapple and cassava. It had served 569 individual farmers and 5 farmers' associations.

In cassava production, the planting materials were produced by the 80 individual farmers and 3 group beneficiaries in Tarangnan and Paranas themselves; the program was responsible for the provision of fertilizers and multi–cultivator, and conduct of the necessary training. On the other hand, harvest for pineapple production is foreseen in 2–3 years yet.

In the meantime, the farmers engage in other productive farm–related activities to earn income while waiting for the crops to bear fruit.

For 2020, the strategy of giving interventions has gradually moved from individual farmers to group beneficiaries. This is important to gain traction in the market, as group production in large volumes would attract wholesale buyers and industrial partners. It would also help the association develop their entrepreneurial prowess and in finding markets for their products.

Thirty-five (35) barangays in 14 municipalities and cities were the focus of interventions for the year. Proportionately, 35 groups, or one per barangay, became beneficiaries of projects in the areas of upland rice production, upland rice and native chicken production, goat production, sweet corn production, native chicken and hybrid corn production, egg layer production, and swine production.

 $\mathbf{F}_{\mathsf{ishing}}$  and agriculture are the major economic activities in Samar province. It has a total of 21 coastal municipalities and two coastal cities with 409 coastal barangays (DILG).

Fishery Profile

The province has 39, 656 fisherfolks registered through DA-BFAR Fisherfolk Registration System (FRS). Registered municipal fishing boats were recorded at 11, 614 with 8, 647 motorized and 2, 967 non-motorized boats.

Commercial fishing has 68 registered fishing boat operators and 98 licensed fishing vessels. The province has 2 major fishing grounds, namely: East Visayan Sea and Samar Sea.

The province is well-known for its Green Mussel Industry, and the town of Jiabong is considered as the "tahong" capital in the region. Samar is a major producer of green mussels supplying many markets in the Philippines, with more than 892.24 ha devoted for tahong farming. At present, there are 201 farmers engaged in mussel and oyster farming.

The province is also engaged in other aquaculture livelihoods like seaweed farming (Kappaphycus alverezii); and milkfish and grouper are cultured either in marine fish cages or fish pens.

Tilapia culture is done in brackish water or freshwater ponds and freshwater fish cages and pens. Mariculture production was pegged at 1,144,663.76 kg, while freshwater production was at 43,100 kg.

## FISHERY SECTOR

L hrough the BFAR-SAAD Program in Samar, DA extended its projects to the fishers in the far-flung areas in the province.

During the 1<sup>st</sup> year of the program's implementation in 2017, the budget was transferred to the PLGU Samar. Being in charge of its implementation, PLGU Samar identified the fisherfolk-beneficiaries to participate in various capture and aquaculture interventions from its selected nine coastal municipalities.

The BFAR-PFO Samar provided more aquaculture projects to the island and coastal municipalities of the province in 2018 and 2019.

In 2018, PFO Samar distributed units of various fishing gears as capture fisheries intervention and established rice-fish culture/backyard pond, satellite *tilapia* hatchery, and technology demonstration station for aquaculture.

Further, in 2019, or its final year of implementation, PFO Samar assisted and provided the fishers with solar fish dryers, dried fish processors; fishing gears, rice-fish culture/backyard pond, and grouper cages.

# BACKGROUND

R

Darangay Patag is located near the town proper of Paranas, Samar, situated along the provincial road to Eastern Samar. Its land areas are mostly plain, hilly, and mountainous.

Most farmers are engaged in rice farming because 70% of the area is rice fields. Most farms are irrigated while a small portion is rainfed. The rest of the area is either forest or planted with crops and coconut.

Before being organized into an association, the members of the Patag Kauswagan Farmers' Association (FA) were beneficiaries of the Department of Social and Welfare Development's Pantawid Pamilya Pilipino Program (4Ps). Their journey with the SAAD Program started when Provincial Coordinator Kristine Dorothea T. Danago visited the barangay and conducted an assessment and validation for potential recipients of the Corn Production Project for FY 2019 valued at Php 1,210,000.00.

Fortunately, the program prioritized the most marginalized farmers, especially members of 4Ps, so the association qualified.

The farmers were encouraged to form an association within 2020 and register with DOLE. Ms. Ida Cabrito was the elected President of the association.

Being an association was not a 'walk in the park' but still, the members persisted to make it work. It is difficult to work individually, but they figured out that they can accomplish more as a group.



## PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION & MANAGEMENT

#### $\mathbf{T}$

L he members were provided with technical training on Hybrid Corn Production upon the implementation of the project. Resource persons from the Office of the Provincial Agriculturist – Corn Team taught the group how to manage the crop for a bountiful harvest.

The group received 40 bags of hybrid corn seeds, 240 bags of organic fertilizer, 240 bags of complete fertilizer, and 80 bags of urea fertilizer in July 2019. That same year, a corn sheller and a power tiller with a multicultivator were also given to the association.

About 1/4 ha of the land area owned by one of its members was planted with corn as a group, while each member also planted corn individually.

At the start, they didn't have funds for labor, but through regular *pintakasi* or community shared effort, they were able to establish a communal area.

Having the multicultivator was a big help to them since they don't own a carabao. The use of the farm machinery lessened their expenses compared to the first planting of corn on August 23, 2019.

## KEY RESULTS AND PLANS

A fter receiving the inputs, the association planted the seeds immediately. The inputs provided to them were good for 40 ha. However, the association has only 2 ha available for planting. The 38 ha were taken up by the members of the association. The agreement was that individual members would give a share to the association after harvest and marketing.

In December 2019, they individually harvested young corn and mature corn from their first cropping. The young corn was sold for Php 5.00 per kg and the mature corn for Php 10.00 per kg. The total earnings of the members amounted to Php 84,237.50, of which 30% worth Php 25,271.25 was shared with the association.

Aside from the income they earned from their individual production, the association earned Php 6,205.00 from the harvest in their communal area. To add up, the association's total income was Php 31,476.25.

Aside from the income, they also gained recognition from LGU–Paranas as a good example to other registered associations.

According to Ms. Cabrito, SAAD has inspired the group to organize and acknowledge the livelihood project as a blessing to their community.

Now that they have formally become an association, Patag Kauswagan FA is now united and strengthened that they set goals to become successful. Their plans include:

- 1. Encouraging members to help each other and reconcile problems within the association;
- 2. Inquiring experts on corn management production to increase their harvest; and
- 3. Establishing linkage with other associations and LGU-Paranas.

"Nang dahil sa SAAD Program, nagkakaisa kaming mga magsasaka at naging mas seryoso kami sa mga layunin namin. Nabigyan pa kami ng multicultivator at napagaan nito ang aming pagsasaka. Sana marami pa kayong matulungan," Ms. Cabrito said.

(Because of SAAD Program, we became more cooperative and serious in the pursuit of our goals. We were even provided with a multicultivator, which made farming practice easier.)

Ms. Cabrito also shared that the association plans to undergo peanut processing to produce peanut butter and other products to widen their market and expand the potential of their association.

# BACKGROUND

 $\mathbf P$ arina, a barangay in the municipality of Jiabong in the province of Samar, has a population of 657 based on the 2015 Census.

The area is composed mainly of rice irrigated areas, where the majority of people engage primarily in farming.

Jiabong Upland Developers Association (JUDA), a group of 227 farmers in the barangay, was endorsed by the Municipal Agriculture Office (MAO) to be beneficiaries of the tractor and rice thresher under Rice Production Project FY 2017 of the SAAD Program.

Upon validation, Provincial Coordinator Kristine Dorothea T. Danago observed a unified and family-oriented group. The vision and purpose of the association are to have a livelihood income that will help their families survive against poverty.

JUDA is DOLE-registered since 2012. They were involved with various government projects such as planting fruit trees within their community under the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR).

They saved their income from DENR for bigger and better projects so that association members don't need to go to cities to find work.

## PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION & MANAGEMENT

In 2017, they received a hand tractor and a rice thresher. Also, 28 members received rice seeds, a complete package of fertilizers, and rice production training. This has been a good start for the group because it was their first time to be granted projects from the Department of Agriculture RFO 8.

After receiving the machines in November 2018, they attended the training on machinery operation initiated by the MAO Jiabong. Two members of the group were assigned to be operators.

JUDA president Concepcion Mabilangan was very grateful for the assistance and constant monitoring of the SAAD Program. She said that the trust given to them has given them the confidence to pursue their farming.

Managing the project isn't that easy. The association faced challenges especially that their group has more than 200 members. The president had a hard time

making decisions because she thinks of every member's situation.

However, because of the guidance of the PPMSO SAAD team and their eagerness to accomplish their plans, hand in hand they set goals according to the SAAD guidelines.

The association is mainly composed of rice farmers. They plant rice seeds of different variety twice in a year. Twenty-eight (28) 4Ps members received the Rice inputs and planted it to a 19.75 ha land area last November 2017.

# **KEY RESULTS**

 ${\bf A}$  total of 18 ha area has already been harvested from what was planted in November 2017. The members accumulated a total income of Php 633,250.00 from the 37.35 MT produced.

After a series of trials, the hand tractor and rice thresher have been utilized. Primarily, the tractor started earning income in May 2019 (1<sup>st</sup> cropping season). They have accumulated a total income of Php 16,000.00 which serviced 9 ha area owned by the members.

The amount was used as an additional capital of the association for their project, which is the JUDA Swimming Pool. On the 2<sup>nd</sup> cropping season in 2019 (November), the pool earned Php 20,000.00 which has serviced 10.25 ha area.

For the year 2019, the total income of JUDA from the tractor alone was Php 36,000.00. The amount was used for the construction of the JUDA pool, which started its operation on April 26, 2019.

Because of the contribution of the machines that the SAAD Program has given, the association has started another livelihood. From April 2019 to September 2019, the total income of the pool was Php 201,054.00. They returned the amount to the association fund for the maintenance of the tractor.

# PLANS

As of today, the members continue to plant rice as one of the top priority commodities in their barangay. The association also plans to buy the product of their members and be the one to market it.

One of the plans of JUDA is to build a learning site. They want to tie up with the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) and the Spark Samar Tourism.

Due to the impressive performance of the association, the group has been chosen by the SAAD to be a recipient of the Swine Production Project under the FY 2020 Program. Despite the COVID-19 situation in Samar, it did not hinder JUDA to start working on the project.


They constructed the pigpen which costs nearly Php 100,000.00. On October 24, they received eight gilts, 16 bags of grower feeds, drugs and biologics, with other interventions to be delivered before the year ends.

According to Mabilangan, *"Unti-unti na naming natutupad ang aming mga Pangarap. Dahil sa SAAD Program, may nagbigay ng inspirasyon na kaya naming umasenso basta't nagkakaisa at nagtutulungan."* (Little by little, we are moving towards reaching out goals. The SAAD Program has given us inspiration to prosper through collaboration and cooperation.)

Through the Swine Project that the SAAD Program has given to them, they envision to venture into meat processing and swine enterprise development.

According to PSA in 2018, "3 in every 10 families in Eastern Visayas are poor." PSA classifies the provinces into clusters; Cluster 1 comprises the bottom poor provinces while Cluster 5 are the least poor provinces. Leyte moved to Cluster 3 in the first semester of 2018 from Cluster 2 in the same semester in 2015. This is an indicative sign that the projects implemented had helped many poor families in meeting their daily basic needs and had improved their quality of life.

From 2018 to 2019, the province had received interventions on Layer Chicken Production, Swine Production, Corn Production, Rice Production, Vegetable Production, and Duck Production.

SAAD served a total of 1,164 individual farmers and 45 associations from the municipalities of Dagami, Pastrana, Sta. Fe, Alangalang, Lapaz, Julita, Burauen, Tabontabon, Leyte, Tabango, Capoocan, San Miguel, San Isidro, Calubian, Matag–ob, and Villaba.

Through the provision of projects, the farmer-beneficiaries gained socioeconomic strength. Many lives have been touched by the SAAD Program through its objectives of helping farmers from the marginalized areas and filling the gap by addressing the needs of underserved farmers.

The onset of implementation made the SAAD Leyte team realize that farmers were only producing food they were used to although they have the innate ability to produce and sell to maximize profit and improve their lives.

In 2020, the main goal of the SAAD Leyte team is to transform associations from subsistence farming to sustainable livelihoods. It is quite challenging to the young team, but it fuels the eagerness of seeing what the other side of the scenario would be.

Currently, the team had created the following strategies: (1) maximize technical assistance through comprehensive and automated production data template; (2) minimize errors in implementation through provision of operations manual; (3) provision of field training in the enhancement and strengthening of associations; (4) provision of

The strategies had shifted the beneficiaries' mindset and improved their entrepreneurial skills. The team projected an increase in the number of associations with sustainable enterprises that help not only members through mutual aid benefits and dividends but also locals through employment.

## PROVINCIAL PROFILE

Physical Profile

T he province of Leyte ranks eight in size among larger islands in the Philippine Archipelago. It lies adjacent to the island of Samar, connected by the San Juanico Strait, and east of the islands of Cebu and Bohol. It is bounded in the north by the Carigara Bay and in the east by the Leyte Gulf. To the west is the Camotes Sea, while the province of Southern Leyte lies south.

It is the largest and the oldest province in the Eastern Visayas region comprising approximately 27% (571,276 ha) of the region's total land area of 2,143,169 ha (DENR RFO 8, 2016). It is composed of 40 municipalities and two (2) cities, Ormoc and Baybay, which serve as its commercial centers. It has five (5) congressional districts and has a total of 1,503 barangays.

# Poverty Situation

Leveyte is included in the list of the poorest provinces in the Philippines with 31.4% poverty incidence among families in 2012. A noticeable decrease in the poverty incidence was seen for the year 2015 with a rate of 23.6%. This has been the highest decrease the province has ever experienced since 2006.

The 2015 PSA report also showed that the municipality of Leyte recorded the highest poverty incidence rate at 47.1% and the City of Tacloban to have the lowest poverty incidence rate at 21.5%.

Agricultural Profile

#### T

L he total land area in Leyte utilized for agriculture in 332,018 ha. Of the provinces in the region, it also has the largest area for cropland (322,252 ha) which is 97% of its total agricultural lands. Leyte also has the most extensive rice lands of 84,277 ha.

On the 2018 PSA Report, the major crops of the province include rice, coconut, and corn. The crops have a total volume of production of 486, 878 MT, 94,475 MT, and 48,300 MT, respectively.

For the poultry sector, the province has the highest production (volume) of native (improved) chicken and duck.

For the livestock sector, the province has the highest production of swine and carabao. The PSA recorded that the province has produced 55,368 chicken, 677 ducks, 51,174 pigs, and 5,699 carabaos for the year 2019.

AGRICULTURE SECTOR

The program showed promise in the three Samar provinces through its impact on farmers and their communities, the management saw the need to integrate Leyte and Southern Leyte in 2018 into the list of SAAD

Hence, the SAAD Program in Region 8 provided livelihood intervention to 15 municipalities in Leyte which has the highest poverty incidence in 2018.

In its first year of implementation, the budget was allocated to projects on corn and vegetable production, swine production and fattening. A total of 1,304 individual farmers and 33 groups of farmers were given agricultural inputs in 74 barangays located in 15 municipalities.

Beneficiaries underwent a thorough selection before they were benchmarked; thence followed the delivery of project assistance to them. They likewise underwent the required training before the distribution of agri-inputs. Training activities were conducted for appropriate technologies, including leadership training, values formation, and financial literacy.

Assistance came in the form of seeds, inorganic and organic fertilizers, machineries and equipment, small farm implements, animals (boars and gilts), feeds, additional support, such as UV film, plastic mulch and crates, moisture meter, dryer thermometer, and hogstel.

In 2019, there were 90 barangays in 14 municipalities covered by the program, assisting 1,697 individual farmers and 39 groups. They were provided with rice, corn, and vegetable production, swine production and fattening, and egg layer production.

The projects implemented in 2020 were placed in 14 barangays situated in five municipalities. About 350 individual farmers and 14 groups benefited from the interventions. These were in the areas of duck, swine, egg layer, jackfruit, and goat production.

Jackfruit, of the EVIARC Sweet variety, is a champion commodity of DA-Regional Field Office 8, which is being introduced to farmers in Matag-ob, Leyte for propagation because of its sure market once the trees have borne fruits.

Vegetable farmers in Sta. Fe and Matag-ob saw an opportunity to help the communities during the COVID-19 pandemic crisis by selling their bumper harvest at lesser prices.

The Bulod Farmers Association of Sta. Fe even gave for free more than 200 pcs *upo* (bottle gourd) to DA–RFO 8 staff as a sign of gratitude for the assistance it provided the group.

Fishery Profile

Leveyte has seven major fishing grounds, namely: Carigara Bay, Leyte Gulf, San Pedro Bay, Camotes Sea, Ormoc Bay, Danajon Bank, and the Visayan Sea.

Municipalities on the eastern side of the province, facing Leyte Gulf and San Pedro Bay, experience an abundance of fish on its peak season during Northeast Monsoon (November-March) and lean season during Southwest Monsoon (April-October).

On the other hand, municipalities abutting Carigara Bay experience an opposite season pattern. Major aquaculture commodities in the province are *bangus*, tilapia, seaweeds, shellfish, and shrimp.




he PFO Leyte spearheaded the implementation of the SAAD program in the province. The team works hand-in-hand with the LGU through their respective MAO in identifying barangays, possible beneficiaries, and feasible livelihood interventions most needed by fishermen.

In line with this, interviews and profiling of fisherfolks have been done to gather baseline data in identifying beneficiaries for the project.

The budget is allocated for skills training and capacity building, program management, aquaculture projects with post-harvest interventions.

Currently, the said office allocated Php 8 million for aquaculture projects to boost the fisheries production amid the pandemic crisis.



## BACKGROUND

#### **T**

**L** abango was ranked 6<sup>th</sup> among the poorest municipalities in Leyte, according to the PSA data in 2012. Thus, in hope of mitigating poverty in the area, the SAAD Program in DA Region 8 provided swine fattening intervention to Omaganhan Farmer Collaborators of Agro–Forestry Association (OFCAA).

OFCAA is composed of farmers from Brgy. Omaganhan, who are engaged in corn and upland rice production. Led by 52-year-old Mrs. Erlinda Quinto, the group was registered with DOLE on February 2, 2007.

When the SAAD Program was introduced to the association in 2018, there were only 31 members registered and profiled as individual beneficiaries who all agreed to manage Swine Fattening enterprise as an association.

As the project was implemented, the membership increased from 31 to 49. All of them enjoy dividends from sales and interest income generated from the enterprise.



### PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION AND MANAGEMENT

#### T

he SAAD Program provided specialized training on community organizing, leadership training, financial literacy, and swine fattening management before the implementation of the project.

The group was also provided with 105 swine and sets of feeds (starter, grower, and finisher) for its 1<sup>st</sup> production cycle.

OFCAA adopted a clustering or semi-communal type of producing fatteners in six (6) groups. Each group takes charge of maintaining the health, nutrition, and hygiene of the animals until they are mature enough to be marketed.

However, as in any endeavor, problems were encountered during the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> production cycles. Low quality of piglets was delivered, delivery of feeds and stocks were untimely causing feeds to deteriorate before stocks were delivered, high transportation cost;

Upon project implementation, the association agreed that shares are generated from the net income computed as total sales less expenses. The members shall return the association's investment capital after every cycle for the sustainability of the project. Then, the net income is subdivided into 1:1:4 – 16.67% share for the association; 16.67% for the housing rent; and 66.67% for the members.

The association's net income will be shared with every group but repairs and maintenance of housing will be their responsibility. They also agreed to put up capital for microcredit worth Php 75,000.00.

Mrs. Quinto said, "Naa'y share ang officers ug naa'y dividend ang members nga dili individual beneficiaries guikan sa association's share, aron ma-ingganyo pud ug mabayran ang kahago sa officers." (Officers will have a share and members who are not individual beneficiaries will receive dividends from the association's share so that officers will be inspired and their efforts are compensated.)

### **KEY RESULTS**

According to their inventory records, the association sold 235 heads of swine from January 2019 (2<sup>nd</sup> cycle) to June 2020 (5<sup>th</sup> cycle), with a total of Php 1,748,410.00 as its gross sales.

From 2019 up to the present, the project helped all the members through their shares. It had reached Php 142,733.80 as individual beneficiary income. Meanwhile, each member also received an annual dividend of Php 198.00.

According to a member, "Nilambo me tungod kay amo kining guikasabutan, pinangunahan sa among president. Dili gyud kine namo mapadayun, dili mi managhan, ug dili me molambo kung guipasagdan lang namo ug wala'y tarong nga plano sa pagbahin-bahin. Pero kay tungod maayu man ang pagduma, ania kami nagpadayon ug nagpasalamat sa tanan ninyong (SAAD) guihatag sa amoa. Dako kaayong tabang tungod kay naa na mi kakuhaan ug pampalit bisan lang sa guinagmay."

(We progressed because there was cooperation among us led by our president. We could not have grown, multiplied, nor progressed, if we continued without any clear plans for sharing. Because of good management, we continued to be grateful for all that you (SAAD) provided to us. This is a big help as we already have a source to buy even the smallest purchases.)

Challenges in the hog-raising industry such as low market share and monopolistic behavior have caused tension to local/backyard raisers like OFCAA. They ventured into financial diversification through investing in microcredit to fight inflation and get another source of dividend income for its members.

OFCAA integrated its swine fattening business to microcredit, offering a small amount from the association's income at 5% interest rate with 6 months diminishing rate. This allowed its poor members to have capital without physical collateral, thus, helping them invest on their own, have access to food, and improve their quality of life; thereby contributing a positive impact on the local economy and the agricultural sector as a whole.



The members stated, "Kaming mga beneficiary sa SAAD Program, kaming mga miembro sa OFCAA, nagkasinabot nga ang baboy nga guihatag, ineghalin sa ila, amo kining kuhaan sa puhunan sa feeds ug medisina. Ug ang sobra, amo pa jud kuhaan sa uban pa nga mga expenses. Ang net income sharing, i-divide namo into 6 shares: (1) sa tangkal; (1) sa association; ug (4) sa miembro na nag-atiman sa baboy. Ang halin sa baboy, amo na pud ipalit ug mga baktin ug feeds aron mapadayun ang project sa SAAD, ug makatabang pud kini sa among pakabuhian. Amo kining ampingan ug amo kining alagaan aron kini molambo ug makatabang sa miembro sa among association isip-livelihood. Daghan kaayong salamat sa taga-SAAD sa mga malumo ninyo nga kasingkasing nga inyong guitabangan kining pobre nga association, OFCAA. Sa sunod pa ninyo nga mga tabang, usbon namo, daghan jud kaayong salamat."

(As beneficiaries of the SAAD Program and as members of OFCAA, we agreed that upon selling the pigs given to us, we will deduct expenses for feeds, biologics, and other costs of production. The net income will be divided into 6 shares as follows: one for the pigpen; one for the association; and four for members who took care of the pigs. Sales income will be used to propagate the SAAD project by buying additional pigs and feeds to sustain it. We will nurture and care for it so it will grow and help the association members as their livelihood. Thank you very much for your kind hearts that you helped this humble association, OFCAA. For forthcoming projects, thank you in advance.)

According to Mrs. Quinto, "We are planning to engage in agri-merchandise, providing feed supplies and farm products. I'm sure it would be better, unya ipadayon gyud guihapon namo ang pa-loan sa mga members kay makatabang gyud intawon nila, labi na nga mga corn farmers ni sila. Ipuhunan ug para makapalit ug mga butang."

(Then, we will continue giving out loans to members as this will surely help them especially that they are corn farmers. They can use it as capital to purchase supplies.)

The association will be the proposed beneficiary for the 2021 Chicken Layer Intervention, and the members were very happy upon knowing it. They exclaimed, "Salig lang mo, Ma'am, kay dili gyud na mausik diri namo." (Just have faith in us, Ma'am, for this will surely not go to waste.)

The quote says, "If you will fail to plan, you plan to fail." Since OFCCA has a leader with a strong vision, a higher percentage of success is expected.

## BACKGROUND

Leyte is a municipality in the northernmost part of the Leyte province, facing the island of Biliran. The urban center is strategically located at the base of the bay with a total land area of 23,830 ha.

The Leyte bay provides all kinds of edible fishes and crustaceans. Among the seashells that abound in the area are the *barinday*, which is commercially exported to other countries. *Bahong* are likewise cured and sold in other regions. *Aguehis* are shipped to fishpond operators in the country as prawn feed while *punao*, *tahong*, *iwi*, *masabay*, *takin*, *sarad*, *lampirong*, *tuway*, *ugpan*, *tudlon-datu*, *talaba*, and *sisi* are a few of the bivalves locally consumed.

Furthermore, *bagungon*, *piyong*, *dalu-dalu*, *bungkawil*, and susu are some of the univalves that find their place in the dining table of Leyteños.





#### ABOUT SITIO MULHO TALABA GROWERS ASSOCIATION

"A penny saved is a penny earned." Many must have heard Benjamin Franklin's famous expression but only a few have practiced. Undeniably, saving itself is an education that fosters self-discipline and patience. The virtues serve as a stronghold of hope for the oyster farmers in Barangay Calaguise in Leyte, Leyte as they wait for a bountiful harvest in November and December 2020.

"Importante nga mayada kami pangabuton ha dagat nga amon ma incoman oras han pagdagko. Pinaka alkansya namon ha dagat," Mr. Danilo Gunsad, member of Sitio Mulho Talaba Growers Association shared. (It is important to have something that we can earn from, once it [oyster] grows. It serves as our piggy bank in the sea.)

Mr. Gunsad and the other 14 SAAD beneficiaries of the association fondly call oyster farming as an underwater "alkansyahan" (money bank) since they have to patiently wait for six months or more until the oysters reach their marketable size. It serves not just as a mere source of income but also an instrument in enriching themselves with the core values of a real fisher- a person of optimism, patience, and sustainability.

They initially received materials for oyster production and technical assistance from the Japan International Cooperation Agency in 2013, which led to the creation of their association. Four years onward, the BFAR through its National Shellfish Development Program chose them as a beneficiary of oyster culture materials to fuel their passion and determination to uplift their lives through its sustainable production.

To further empower the group on the endeavor, BFAR chose them again to become a recipient of the SAAD Program in 2019. Other than having an area with an abundant natural oyster stock suitable for production, the association possesses a commendable track record which made them an evident choice as SAAD's beneficiary in Leyte province.

m M}$  r. Gunsad and the other members underwent training on the production of oysters and received Php 203,625.00 worth of input materials from the FY 2019 budget of the SAAD Program. The 15 cultivation lines installed in January 2020 are projected to produce more than a ton or Php 300,000 worth of oysters by November or December.

The input materials given can last up to two-three years with proper care and maintenance. Compared to the makeshift spat collectors, oysters can be easily pulled out from the installed ones made from HDPE, providing a more convenient way of harvesting for senior fisherfolk.

L rue enough, the solidarity of the relationships between husbands and wives of the SAAD beneficiaries in Leyte, Leyte are strengthened by their willingness to work with one another.

"Ang matagpamilya mayada gud pagtinabangay sa mag-asawa. Kay ang usa kapamilya di maghago, way income pero kun maghago ang matag-usa o ang matagpamilya wa gud kapobre na muabot, kun matag-usa mulihok," said Mrs. Visitacion M. Marientes, President of Sitio Mulho Talaba Growers Association.

(The husband and wife in the family should help one another. Poverty would not exist if each of the family members will work hard, but doing the opposite will result in low/no income.)

Mrs. Marientes, along with the wives of the member-beneficiaries, were empowered by performing equally important tasks on the oyster production of their association. They help their husbands create the culture lines and take an active part in the local promotion and marketing of their produce. At times, they even accompany their husbands on installing and monitoring the oyster modules.

#### Old You May Say, But Work We Say Hey

The program is also a great help to their senior citizen members who can no longer go fishing offshore. Mr. Jose Salino, a 63-year-old talaba grower gratefully shared, "Sanglit nagpapasalamat ako nga bisan naman la ginagmay nga mga bulig, dako man gihapon inin nga para ha amon labi na yana kami, ako in lagas na, diri na nalahutay gud ha pagkadto ha dagat. Inin nala nga butang an akon gin aatiman hini nga pagpatubo hin talalaba."

(I am thankful that even in small ways, it can help us especially now that we are already old, we can no longer go fishing. Looking after this oyster culture is the only thing that I do.)

## **PROJECT RESULTS AND PLANS**

hough the oysters are yet to be harvested, Mr. Salino and some of the members of the association get some to put food on their families' tables. This is to minimize frequent visits to public markets and lessen the possibility of exposing themselves to the unseen threats of the pandemic.

Also, despite the input materials being sustainable and adaptive for their community, challenges on monitoring and transporting their produce are oftentimes encountered since Barangay Calaguise is situated in an interior part of the municipality.

Both Mr. Gunsad and Mr. Salino shared their hopes of building a guardhouse and acquiring a motorboat for constant monitoring of their installed culture lines and immediate transportation of their goods to prospective buyers in nearby municipalities and islands.

Mrs. Marientes and the other members of the association also envision to purchase additional materials for their culture lines from their expected profit. *"Ang halin sa akong pagtalabahan, igdugang nako pagpalit, continuous ang among trabaho."* (I will be buying input materials for our continuous operation, using my previous earnings in oyster production.)

Further, the association is willing to leap on processing their products to reach larger markets, and have a stable and direct consolidation not only of their products but of other associations in Leyte, Leyte who venture into oyster production.

*"Diri lang na sige lang ang gobyerno, kailangan mi mutabang mi sa gobyerno.* Give and take," Mrs. Marientes added. (It should not only be the government, but we (fisherfolk) should also help the government.)

Armed with self-discipline, patience, solidarity, and courage, the people of Calaguise through their oyster production will continue to fulfill the real *"saad"* towards a prosperous and sustainable future of the Philippine fisheries industry. With the will to be one with the bureau on attaining a *"Malinis at Masaganang Karagatan"*, they will continue to be of service to the people in providing fresh and accessible food.

O outhern Leyte farmers are known for being resilient amid difficulties. Exhaustion is put aside just to support the family. Despite belonging to the "poorest of the poor" communities, they are industrious and willing to help their fellow people improve their lives.

The SAAD Program included Southern Leyte in the list of its priority provinces in 2018. The SAAD farmer-partners were from the municipalities of Malitbog, Tomas Oppus, Bontoc, Sogod, Libagon, Liloan, St. Bernard, San Francisco, and Pintuyan.

The farmers are timid, but with constant coordination and regular meetings, they opened up and showed that they are dedicated to working for their families.

Selected farmers received agri-inputs and machinery related to corn, cassava, rice, and swine production and fattening projects. In 2019, the same interventions were provided, with additional projects on native chicken and mallard duck production.

SAAD also conducted training for crop and livestock production and capability training in leadership and financial literacy. This is to prepare them to become entrepreneurs, and not settle as mere farmers who subsist on daily earnings. We teach them to build and manage the livelihood project and eventually develop them into sustainable enterprises.

To prevent the African Swine Fever (ASF) from contaminating the local hog population, the Swine Fattening Production Project became one of the sources of fattened pigs when the PLGU ordered the sourcing of pigs from Mindanao. ASF has, in one way or the other, become a blessing to local swine raisers as they considered it an opportunity during the crisis.

The SAAD Southern Leyte is blessed to have supportive partners in the PLGU, MLGU, PAgSO, and PVSO (Provincial Veterinary Services Office), that are willing to extend their services to cater to farmers' needs. Everyone is working towards a common goal, which is to uplift the lives of poor and deserving farmers.

## SOUTHERNLEYTE PROVINCIAL PROFILE Physical Profile

Southern Leyte Province is one of the six provinces in the Eastern Visayas Region, neighboring Leyte Province in the north, facing the Pacific in the east, the Camotes Sea in the west, and Sogod Gulf in the south.

The province was once a part of Leyte before it was made into a separate province by the year 1960. It is composed of one congressional district, a city (Maasin City being its Capital), and 18 municipalities.

Its total land area corresponds to 8.1% (173,480 ha) of the total area of the Eastern Visayas Region. The province is composed of a mainland and four islands. The biggest is Panaon Island that includes the municipalities of Liloan, San Francisco, Pintuyan, and San Ricardo. Following are the island Municipality of Limasawa, the island barangays of San Pablo, and San Pedro of the Municipality of Hinunangan.

# Poverty Situation

Outhern Leyte registered a poverty incidence among families of 34% in 2012 and decreased to 30.2% in 2015, according to the PSA.

Southern Leyte is the other province, aside from Leyte, that was added to the list of beneficiaries of the SAAD Program in 2018.

The municipality of Malitbog has the highest poverty incidence at 46.2% while the City of Maasin has the lowest at 33%.

Agricultural Profile

S outhern Leyte is an agricultural province complemented by the growth in the services sector. The major sources of income in the province are farming and fishing.


The major crops grown are coconut, rice, banana, rice, root crops, fruits, and vegetables. Livestock and poultry are mostly raised in the backyard and are used for home consumption and special occasions. Carabaos are mostly used in farming and hauling agricultural products from the farm to the market.

Based on the 2018 data of PSA, coconut is the major crop of the province. It has a volume of production of 127,750 MT for a harvested area of 32,150 ha, giving an average yield of 3.97 MT/ha. Following coconut as a major crop are rice (rainfed and irrigated palay), white corn, and banana.

The province has the highest production of native/improved chicken under poultry, while swine is recorded the highest in livestock production. The PSA recorded that the province has produced 301,248 chickens and 30,293 swine for the year 2019.

L he selection of farmer recipients followed a rigorous process of validation, verification, profiling, and geotagging. Upon completion of the process, farmers were given project interventions. They likewise underwent the required training before the distribution of agri–inputs.

In 2018, 143 barangays located in 8 municipalities were covered by the program.

1,836 farmer constituents and 7 associations were provided with livelihood projects for them to earn additional income. Projects implemented for the year were in the areas of rice, corn, and cassava production, and swine production and fattening. Assistance came in the form of seeds, inorganic and organic fertilizers, machineries and equipment, cassava planting materials, animals (gilts and boars), feeds, drugs and biologics, incubators, solar-powered equipment, and hogstel.

The SAAD Southern Leyte team invited the staff of PAgSO/LGU and the Provincial Veterinary Office who were only too willing to serve as resource persons during capability enhancement activities for farmers, including leadership training, values orientation, and financial literacy seminars. The team also tapped the expertise of agricultural technicians of feed suppliers to lecture and conduct hands–on demo during livestock and poultry training.

Seven (7) projects, which covered 118 barangays in 9 municipalities, were implemented in 2019.

A total of 1,028 individual farmers and 17 groups were provided with agri–inputs in the areas of rice, corn, and cassava production, mallard duck and native chicken production, and swine production and fattening.

As in the case of Samar Province, the planting materials for cassava production were produced by the 99 individual farmers and 2 group beneficiaries in Malitbog, Tomas Oppus, Bontoc, Sogod, and Liloan themselves; the program was responsible for the provision of fertilizers and cassava spinner and shredder, and conduct of the necessary training.

The Provincial Veterinarian of Southern Leyte, in coordination with the provincial staff, formulated

an Operational Manual for Swine Fattening Enterprise, which is now being adopted by farmers' associations engaged in the project throughout the province. The reader-friendly guidebook, which is very comprehensive, has become a blueprint as well for swine fattening enterprises in other SAAD Program areas in the region.

For 2020, five projects were established in 22 villages in 7 selected municipalities. These were in the areas of vegetable production, sweet corn and vegetable production, hybrid corn and vegetable production, mallard duck and vegetable production, and swine production.

As the strategy in the selection of beneficiaries has been altered to focus on associations rather than individual farmers, 22 groups became recipients of livelihood projects in 2020. No individual farmer was chosen to receive interventions anymore. Certainly, former beneficiaries were still assisted in regard to the facilitation of their requirements, linkage to markets, and other approaches to aid them in their farming activities.

Swine production has been the preeminent project implemented during the SAAD Program's 2½-years of existence in the province. The ASF-free pigs produced by swine farmers had become popular, especially at the height of the outbreak in the country. Provincial officials had been very careful with the entry of hogs from Mindanao by setting up safeguards to ensure that the disease does not contaminate the pigs raised locally; hence, Southern Leyte was declared ASF-free.

There was even a proposition by meat suppliers and wholesalers to import ready-to-harvest pigs from hog farms in the province, but the supply could not even suffice for the requirements of the local population. It is very encouraging to note that the swine production industry, notably those involving hog suppliers from SAAD Program beneficiaries in Southern Leyte, has already made a mark with local officials and the consuming public as a safe and healthful source of hog meat.

Fishery Profile

#### T

L he province of Southern Leyte considers fishing as one of its major means of livelihood considering that all the 18 municipalities and one city (236 barangays) are coastal.

It has 24,262 registered municipal fisherfolks –18,164 are male and 6,098 are female. These municipal fishers registered 4,851 motorized boats and 3,514 non-motorized boats.

Moreover, the province has recorded 11 licensed commercial fishing boats and seven registered fishing boat operators that recorded an average annual production of 42 metric tons.

The province is also engaged in different aquaculture activities, such as: *Bangus* and Tilapia Culture in Brackishwater and Freshwater Fishpond, Marine and Freshwater Fish Cage, Marine Fish pen, and *Kappaphycus alvarezii* species for Seaweed farming.

# Southern Leyte



he PFO Southern Leyte has closely coordinated with the PAO and the concerned LGUs through their respective MAO in the identification of barangays, possible beneficiaries and suitable livelihood interventions.

Orientation, profiling and validation were conducted to disseminate essential information and ensure that the target beneficiaries qualify for the program.

In 2018, projects were focused on capture fisheries component from which 2,199 individuals and 24 groups benefited from the projects.

Then, in 2019, the budget was allocated for aquaculture projects and project management. Skills training and capability building for fisherfolk were also conducted for the beneficiaries.

For the current year, Php 8 million has been budgeted for aquaculture intervention to boost production amid the pandemic situation. On the other hand, Php 1 million is set aside for project management.





# BACKGROUND

Located at Panaon island in the southernmost tip of Southern Leyte is 5<sup>th</sup> class municipality Pintuyan. Situated between sloppy terrains facing the sea, the constituents subsist on a hand-to-mouth existence, depending on fishing and coconut farming.

One of the selected association beneficiaries for the SAAD Program in 2018 was Manglit Farmers and Fisherfolk Association (MFFA) from Barangay Manglit.

Manglit Farmers and Fisherfolk Association, founded in 2018, is composed of 29 registered members. The majority of the members are fisherfolk and 4Ps beneficiaries. The SAAD Program is the very first government assistance they received, which greatly benefited each member of the association. They underwent a rigorous selection process as Swine Fattening beneficiaries in the municipality.





# PROJECT Implementation

### D

**L** rior to delivery and distribution of the animals, a Swine Fattening Management training was conducted to orient the farmers on proper raising of hogs.

Each beneficiary received a set of three (3) piglets, three bags of starter feeds, 6 bags of grower feeds, 6 bags finisher feeds, drugs and biologics amounting to Php 3,422,520.00.

Among the fortunate beneficiaries was 29-year-old Ms. Arnilyn G. Mantilla.

Ms. Mantilla is a member of Manglit Farmers and Fisherfolk Association. She is a single mother to a 5-year–old boy. Her source of income before joining SAAD and being elected Secretary of the association came from garbage collection.

Similar to other members, she was given three piglets under the Swine Fattening Project worth Php 38,029.00 in August 2018.

Dreaming of owning a house that she could call home with her son, she gave the best out of everything she did. Through hard work and perseverance, she earned Php 34,891.00 from the 1<sup>st</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> cycles of her swine fattening endeavor. As fate would have it, it was inevitable that she was able to build a new home from the gross income she earned.

"It's a nice feeling to build your own home. SAAD has greatly helped us," Ms. Mantilla remarked. She purchased another two piglets for her 5<sup>th</sup> production cycle, with promising returns in the next few months.

Because of her active participation in the project, she was elected President of the association. In giving back to SAAD Program, Ms. Mantilla continues to encourage her comembers and interested farmers to support the Swine Fattening Project that certainly provided an extra source of income for their families.

# BACKGROUND

Libagon is situated at the southern tip of Leyte Island. It is blessed with one of the clearest blue waters in the region so the fisheries sector of the municipality is a thriving industry.

Barangay Nahaong is encompassed by the waters of Sogod Bay, and within the locality are the small and hardworking people of Barangan Nahaong Fisherfolk Association who strive to make a living out of the bounties that their rich seas can offer them.

In 2018, they were chosen to be one of the beneficiaries of the SAAD Program in their province.



#### ABOUT BARANGAY NAHAONG FISHERFOLK ASSOCIATION

U nity and strength can be found at the core of every team. Even with a common goal, a group of people coming together is not necessarily a team, not unless they are in sync and whose members contribute their strengths towards a common goal. This cooperation will ultimately lead a team to achieve its objectives. On the other hand, the unwillingness of members to support the goals of the team can be the cause of internal strife that may lead to its demise.

Mrs. Hermelina Mamac, fisherfolk of Libagon, Southern Leyte, has long acknowledged that to make a living from the ocean, a combined effort from a group of people is necessary. She must know and trust these people and they must be one with her in improving their living conditions and livelihood. She knew without a doubt that the very people who would help her would be her friends and neighbors and so she organized the Barangay Nahaoang Fisherfolk Association.

Leading an association with more than 30 members is a big responsibility and she realizes that while working hard for the betterment of the association, she also needs to be smart and perceptive.

With the consensus of the members, they opted to register their association with government agencies such as the DOLE and the LGU of Libagon so they could be eligible to avail of the loaning programs from private banks or cooperatives as well as apply for assistance from different agencies.

The assistance coming from their province and other non-government organizations enabled the association to finally operate a fish cage. All of the members worked hard for its success so Mrs. Mamac decided to make the project entrepreneurial to sustain their community's needs for a longer period. She wanted their profit to be allotted for the expansion of the project so she asked the members if their share could be used as capital for the expansion to guarantee its sustain ability.

"Sa primero ang among miyembro mga 30, unja ningundang ang uban tungod kay sinugdanan wa mi magbahin kay ang akoa jud makakapital mi sa kanang cage, lisod man ang magbuhi nga wa kay pangkapital kay mangutang pa," Mrs. Mamac expressed as she recounted the struggles of establishing a viable business and encouraging her members to see the advantages of continuing their livelihood.

(At first, we had 30 members, but some of them left because they were not allotted a share of the profit. Since it is hard to continue the business without running capital, I wanted the profit to serve as such for the development of the business and to avoid being buried in debts.)

A number of her members rejected her motion, while the few who believed in her vision remained with her.

Though their association has suffered some losses, Mrs. Mamac still persevered with their business. Soon enough, with the implementation of the SAAD in the province of Southern Leyte, the association was finally granted a boon and once again established their bangus fish cage culture.

# PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION

T hrough the SAAD Program, Barangay Nahaong Fisherfolk Association received input materials for their fish cage comprising 6,500 milkfish fingerlings and 56 sacks of feeds in December 2019. The group also attended an orientation on Bangus Fish Cage Culture conducted by the BFAR Region 8 through the Provincial Fishery Office of Southern Leyte.

m T}$  heir hard work finally paid off when harvest time came as the association decided to partially harvest their milkfish. They were able to record production of 1,597 kg worth Php 207,610.00.

As buyers continued to flock and ask for their produce, the association decided to harvest their milkfish. An additional 411 kg worth Php 53,410.00 was earned by the association.

With their earnings, they managed to secure the capital for their second cropping and to expand from one to two fish cages.

The group decided to set aside 10% of their earnings to be divided among themselves as an incentive and reward for their hard work.

# WAYS FORWARD

"Pasalamat gud mi sa BFAR ug sa SAAD nga natabangan jud mi, kay sa sinugdanan murag gineglect man mi sa iba, pero sa pagkakaron wa jud mutalikod sa amoa ang BFAR." (We are thankful to BFAR and the SAAD program because unlike other organizations they did not neglect our needs.)

Hermilina Mamac expressed her gratitude towards the bureau and the SAAD Program for entrusting them with such assistance and believing in the capability of their association to make the project flourish.

"Ang among problema ron ang butanganon kanan sa among gamit kay nagbuag-buag ang among mga gamit ron kay wa mi kabutangan, unja ang among feeds kaonon sa iro kay dili masaradohan ngadtoa," Mrs. Mamac stated.

("We are having a problem with our storage facility. Because we don't have one, materials are scattered in more than one place and our feeds are sometimes being eaten by stray dogs because the temporary shelter cannot be closed properly.")

Since they are temporarily keeping their materials in one of their members' houses, she wants to construct a storage shed where they can securely store their materials used in fishing and fish cage farming, such as nets, drums, and feeds.

Mrs. Mamac further plans to procure a motorboat to aid them in their aquaculture venture.

As she experienced the power of what a cohesive team can deliver, she encourages all fisherfolk and other associations to help each other and work together for the betterment of their group, which will not only benefit them but their families for a long time.
