



Isang Masaganang Ani at Mataas na Kita mga Ka-agri!

In this issue of SAADventure Magazine, we highlight the milestone of the Special Area for Agricultural Development (SAAD) Program of the Department of Agriculture (DA) in the SOCCSKSARGEN area. Showcasing the bountiful and inexhaustible agricultural sector of the four provinces namely: the province of North Cotabato, Sarangani, Sultan Kudarat, and Maguindanao.

The SAAD Program of the Department of Agriculture aims to assist farmers by providing their necessities to perform their daily farm activities. With the assistance, they are now more capable of producing more food not only for their respective families but for the entire country. This way, the eradication of poverty and the elevation of farmers' way of living becomes a reality.

In Region 12 also known as SOCCSKSARGEN, where there are more remote places, each person can see how the poorest of the poor stand still and continue their struggles in living despite life's chaotic challenges. Everyone can see how they survive each day of their lives. They have limited opportunities and lack of infrastructure in the area such as farm-to-market roads that limit them to access the government's interventions. That's why these people are the main beneficiaries of the SAAD Program. The Program has been giving them essentially ideal assistance for them to improve their living conditions.

In the past four years, SAAD Program has been distributing several interventions to the beneficiaries. These projects include the Integrated Upland Rice Production Project with Livestock and Vegetable Production Project, Integrated Corn Production Project with Poultry and Vegetable Production Project, Dairy Goat Production Project, Horse Dispersal Project, and Mallard Duck Production Project, as well as farming tools and machines.

Whereas, budgets that were utilized in implementing SAAD projects in the region from 2017 to 2019 showed that Cotabato had spent a total of Php 124 million, followed by Sultan Kudarat with Php 116 million, Sarangani with Php 46 million, and Maguindanao with Php 43 million.

Based on the responses that we have heard from the beneficiaries, SAAD Program interventions have changed their lives through the livelihood programs that we have provided them. Especially, during these times of global pandemic, SAAD projects have become a tool for

farmers to survive because, through these interventions, their daily needs were sustained.

These livelihood projects have also nurtured their knowledge and skills to make a huge difference in their lives. They are now becoming more efficient and more productive because they have learned new competencies from the Program's training. The volume of production that they are producing annually has increased significantly compared to the years without SAAD interventions.

The beneficiaries of the SAAD Program were all very thankful to government interventions. The SAAD projects became their steering wheels to drive and move forward to continuously uplift their current status of living. With everyone's support and cooperation, the DA-SAAD Program has been stepping up to defeat poverty and to facilitate farmers and fisherfolk to attain Masaganang Ani at Mataas na Kita.

We are hoping that this magazine will become a helm in sharing and promoting positive changes, as well as knowing the advancement and development that the DA-SAAD 12 has been sharing and entrenching in the region, especially to its recipients, to the community, and the entire country.

The Special Area for Agricultural Development in the SOCCSKSARGEN Region catalyzed change in the lives of the less fortunate farmers in the far-flung barangays of Region 12 SOCSKSARGEN. I assumed the responsibility as Regional SAAD Focal Person on June 2, 2020 through the trust and confidence of DA - RFO12 Regional Executive Director Arlan M. Mangelen. As a public servant who mostly focuses on the field of research, the designation vested in me was a great challenge.

Upon my assumption, the team conducted a meeting with management together with the SAAD Technical Working Group and it was found out that all the interventions for CY 2020 were not yet delivered to the target farmer clientele due to CoViD-19 Pandemic. I had an opportunity to visit different sites in the region where I saw firsthand the real situation of the farmers and had courtesy calls with MLGUs/BLGUs to discuss the livelihood that the program can provide. I am glad to have witnessed the success of some farmer associations.

To fulfill SAAD program promises, the team conducted for the first time the MASS DISTRIBUTION OF INTERVENTIONS in the provinces of Cotabato and Sultan Kudarat to bring the livelihood projects closer to the target farmer-beneficiaries and farmer associations, and witnessed by Provincial and Municipal Local Government Units. During the mid of 2020 and 3rd quarter, the program also facilitated the downloading and turn-over of funds to PLGU Cotabato amounting to Php 25 million for the livelihood projects and to MLGU Alabel, Sarangani amounting to Php 3 million for the Multi-Purpose Drying Pavements (MPDP) projects.

The SAAD Program implementations in the region started in 2017 and to date, 141 specialized training were conducted as well as 77 livelihood projects benefiting 455 farmer associations and 25,745 individual farmer-beneficiaries.

To be a part of the whole nation in attaining inclusive and sustainable peace in implementing E.O. 70, the SAAD SOCCSKSARGEN also extended livelihood projects to End Local Communist Armed Conflict (ELCAC) communities. As of the 3rd quarter of 2020, a total of 14

farmer associations in Cotabato Province and 11 farmer associations in Sarangani were benefited from the program. The implementation was a team approach and strong linkages were established with Local Government Units and the Philippine Army to assure the sustainability of the project.

Amidst CoViD-19 pandemic, most of the beneficiaries earned income by selling swine, eggs, and vegetables in their respective communities at affordable prices during the Enhanced Community Quarantine (ECQ) or even sharing their produce with their neighbors. Most of them were grateful for the program that helps them to become food secure households.

As we heal and recover as one, the DA 12 management and the SAAD Program will continue its objectives of uplifting the lives of poor farming communities by providing training and livelihood endeavors that will capacitate and make them competitive, and help the Philippines in attaining food security.

Good wishes!

The national government had carried out several successful programs to ensure food security and reduce the country's poverty line.

The Special Area for Agricultural Development (SAAD) Program is one of these initiatives of the Department of Agriculture that undertook intensified social ventures towards a food-secure Philippines.

SAAD led to the birth of the Sarangani Diversified Upland Rice Farming Development Project which goals were aligned to the program but modified to fit the needs of the beneficiaries. Other projects were integrated into its implementation to make it comprehensive and sustainable.

The implementation of the SAAD in Sarangani significantly increased the land planted with upland rice from 1,350 in 2016 to 3,000 hectares in 2019.

Substantial growth in harvest was also noted from an average of 600 kg per hectare to 1MT per hectare. It directly addresses the need to decrease hunger incidence in the province and improve the income of the farmer-beneficiaries through the upland rice, OPV corn, and vegetables that they harvested.

Under the leadership of Agriculture Secretary William D. Dar, I am confident that the new strategies built on eight paradigms of "new thinking" will strengthen the implementation of the SAAD Program.



BUDGET UTILIZED

The Special Area for Agricultural Development (SAAD) Program in the SOCCSKSARGEN and Maguindanao received a total budget of Php 504,111.5 million.

The allocation covered three components of the program, the social preparation component, which comprises the training; the production and livelihood interventions (PLI) component, which includes the agricultural intervention packages given to the farmer beneficiaries; and program management office (PMO).

The program chose Sarangani, Cotabato, Sultan Kudarat, and Maguindanao as its priority provinces due to their high poverty incidence among families in 2012 and 2015. Maguindanao, province of the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM), was handled by the DA Region 12 for the implementation of the program.

A. Budget Utilization

The budget utilized for the PLI component totaled to Php 353,175,131 for agriculture sector from 2017 to 2018.

B. Farmers Served

Out of 24,528 individuals served for agriculture sector, 11,495 are members of the 434 groups served.

C. Projects Implemented and Enterprises Developed

The DA Region 12 implemented 76 livelihood projects since 2017. Enterprises will be fully established by 2022.









SARANGANI

PHYSICAL PROFILE

Sarangani has 7 municipalities (Alabel, Malapatan, Glan, Malungon, Maasim, Kiamba, and Maitum) with 141 barangays. The province's land area is 3,601.25 km² with vast beachfront, rolling hills, and plains.

The province's major industries are aquaculture, fishery, agriculture plantations, and tourism.

The common mode of transportation in Sarangani were buses and other public utility vehicles but most of the people ride motorcycles to reach the majority of the barangays. Meanwhile, many IP communities are inaccessible by any transportation, thus walking is the best option.



AGRICULTURE PROFILE

Coconut is the major crop of Sarangani, that is why it is the priority commodity covered under DA's Philippine Rural Development Project. Other major crops grown are palay, corn, banana, sugarcane, pineapple, and mango.

About 66% of the province's total land area is forest land. Half of it is highly cultivated for corn. The areas covered are Malungon, Maasim, Malapatan, and Glan.

For the livestock sector, swine is considered the top with an inventory of 66,317 in 2019. Native Chicken has the highest number of poultry inventory grown in the area at 718,800 in the same year.

POVERTY PROFILE

Based on Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) report, the poverty incidence rate among families in the province increased by 1.3% in 2015. The poverty rate is recorded at 47.3%. There were 543,417 people with 124,313 households. Therefore, at least 58,800 families were below the province's poverty threshold.

The municipality of Malapatan has the highest poverty incidence at 60.9% in 2015 while Alabel has the lowest at 44.7% in the same year.



AGRICULTURE SECTOR


SAAD Sarangani covered its 7 municipalities in 2017 to 2019. The province received a total budget of **Php 92.54 million** from 2017 to 2019 benefiting **4,899 individual** farmers and **24 groups**.

In 2017, the SAAD fund worth Php 15.2 million was transferred to the PLGU, which was able to help 1,290 farmers covering 6 municipalities with 13 barangays. Sarangani focused on the production of open-pollinated variety (OPV) white corn and upland rice, which are suitable for the area's climatic conditions, market demand, and farming practices of the beneficiaries.

In **2018**, the province was granted **Php 13.2 million** worth of interventions procured by the DA Region 12. The SAAD Program covered the same areas as 2017 with **two associations (200 members)** and **1,130 farmers** as beneficiaries. They received assistance for the production of high-value crops, OPV corn, and upland rice.

In **2019**, SAAD Sarangani covered 960 individual farmers and **22 groups (550 members)** in all municipalities. They received interventions worth of **Php 17.8 million** composed of upland rice, OPV corn, dairy goat, and horse production together with agri-inputs, tools, machinery, facilities, and equipment.

As of the present, Sarangani already delivered and distributed most of the projects from the 2019 fund even amid the pandemic.





LOLOY M. CALIMTAN

DIVERSIFIED UPLAND RICE PRODUCTION PROJECT

Brgy. Tuanadato, Maitum, Sarangani Php 14,700.00

BACKGROUND

Loloy M. Calimtan is a T'boli from the mountainous area of Barangay Tuanadato in Maitum, Sarangani. He is a 40-year-old elementary undergraduate. Although he lacks education, he pursued farming and excelled in it.

He grew crops such as abaca, corn, and banana and sold them in the local markets and neighborhood. His monthly income is Php 4,000.00, which is barely enough for his wife and three children's daily needs.

Harvesting from abaca and corn doesn't necessarily guarantee him and his family a good fortune. Only when they were able to sell all their allotted harvests and save up from buying seeds to plant again while compensating the farmworkers could they provide for his family's needs.

Loloy worries about the future of his young children, especially their education. Now that they are close to the proper age of going to school, Loloy always thinks about how he will meet the needs of his family from his small income. He and his wife want to give a good education to their children because they have not experienced it, however, they cannot afford it.

When the SAAD Program arrived in the area in 2017, Loloy's life gradually changed enabling him to invest in his family's house and education.





PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION

Loloy became one of the SAAD beneficiaries who received training and inputs such as upland rice seeds, OPV corn seeds, farm machineries, farming tools, and vegetable seeds worth Php 14,700.00 under the Diversified Upland Rice Production Project for FY 2017.

Loloy's farming methods have improved since SAAD arrived in their community in 2017. Having no access to any form of machinery, he used to plant traditionally. With his sickle or bagging hook, rice sacks, and a vessel made from an old plastic water container, Loloy would manually harvest the upland rice he planted about four months ago to sell it in the market in the lowland areas as well as to his co-farmers in his community.

Thanks to the SAAD Program, Loloy learned the proper methods of farming through acquired knowledge from farmers' assemblies, production technology training on rice, OPV white corn, and vegetable production, crop protection training, postharvest storage training, and animal healthcare management. The training programs allowed him to manage the SAAD interventions effectively.

He also became a part of the Yama Farmers' Association which has 140 members at present. They are working hand-in-hand on every one's planting through *bayanihan*.

When one member succeeded in harvest, he is entitled to share seeds with the community for others to join the association. Loloy was able to share a sack or two of palay and corn with his fellow farmers.

In 2017, there were a total of 360 beneficiaries in Maitum, Sarangani who received a total of Php 4,374,870.00 projects implemented by the SAAD Program.

KEY RESULTS

SAAD Sarangani created five guides for the sustainability and effectiveness of the project. These are tithing, allocating for food consumption, securing seeds for the next planting season, sharing their blessings with other farmers, and marketing.

Loloy religiously followed the five guides that is why he is still able to plant rice until now. Although marketing his upland rice was his last option, he is still glad for he was able to expand his farm and help his neighbors.

Loloy allocated 50% of his harvest for food consumption, 20% for tithing and sharing to other farmers, and the remaining 30% for area expansion for the next cropping. From only a hectare, his planting area extended to five. He is now confident that he can market his upland rice in 2021.

Meanwhile, Loloy's peanut farm is intended for income generation. All harvested peanuts from 2018 to 2020 were sold to the local market.

In 2018, Loloy harvested 118 sacks of peanuts in his 2-ha upland area. However, he harvested less in 2019 due to rat infestation. From this, he sold 74 sacks while others were allocated for the next planting season. Unfortunately, the pests came back in 2020 with more crop loss.

On the other hand, Loloy's wife planted the vegetables in their backyard for food consumption. They also shared some of their harvest to their neighbors while some were sold to nearby communities.

Loloy was also able to build a new house from his income. From a *bahay kubo*, his family's home is now a cemented one. Now, he is saving money for a second house to be constructed near the municipality proper to send his children to school and put a small business like *sari-sari* store.

With the help of the SAAD, Loloy can now sustain and support the farming production cost and his family's needs while saving for the future of his children.



Loloy was very overwhelmed with SAAD because it definitely changed the lives of farmers in their community. SAAD interventions became an instrument to his life in fighting poverty. With the help of SAAD, he can now save for the future of his children, build a house, and put up a small business.

As a successful SAAD beneficiary, Loloy plans to share his fruits of success with his fellow farmers in the community. He wants to share his knowledge and farming ideas that he learned from the SAAD training.

He also encouraged others to join training and workshops of SAAD to learn effective methods in farming.







The DA-SAAD Program changed the lives of farmers and fisherfolk in the country. Since poverty alleviation is its main goal, it truly elevates the poorest of the poor's way of living in the country.

Selecting its beneficiaries is based on the poorest of the poor list in the community, who needs the assistance of the government. By receiving the SAAD interventions, farmers and fishers produce more food, even provide their families' needs despite the global pandemic.

They could also use the interventions to establish an enterprise or put up a simple business.

Aiming to improve the lives of people, especially those who are living in remote areas in the province, the SAAD Cotabato with its agri-related anti-poverty program implemented projects with a total of Php 11.1 million that were provided to 6 municipalities in 2017. Different packages of interventions include: (a) swine production, (b) goat raising, (c) mallard duck production, (d) vegetable production, and (e) corn production were received by 25 farmers' associations and 150 individuals. The intervention was distributed from December 2017 to May 2018.

For 2018, SAAD projects helped the lives of about 3,352 farming households in the province by distributing interventions which were related to the production of upland rice, corn, vegetables, and livestock with a total amount of Php 37 million.


In 2019, 5,966 beneficiaries received Php 41 million worth of SAAD agriculture-related livelihood assistance such as provision of farm machineries and post-harvest facilities, vegetable production, upland rice production, dairy goat production, corn production, Muscovy duck production, free-range chicken production, native swine production, cacao production, floating tiller, hand tractor with trailer, power sprayer, shredder, corn mill, support project for layer chicken production and native pig production were distributed to selected beneficiaries in the province.

Amid the CoViD-19 pandemic, the SAAD Cotabato team is doing its best to extend assistance to the beneficiaries.

In my experience as a team leader, I'm so overwhelmed with the heartfelt gratitude I heard from the beneficiaries. They were thankful to the government, especially to the DA-SAAD, for it changed their lives and uplifted their economic status.

COTABATO

PHYSICAL PROFILE

Cotabato lies on the eastern part of Region 12 and is strategically located in the central part of Mindanao. The land area of the province is a rich vast land resource that stretches over an area of 656,590 hectares representing 36% of the regional land area (1,815,500 hectares). It ranks first in terms of the land area among the four provinces in the region. It is composed of 17 municipalities and a city with 543 barangays.

The soil topography of the province's terrain varies from flat, fertile plains to irregular landscape of wide valleys, scattered hills, and extensive mountain ranges.

AGRICULTURE PROFILE

Among the provinces in the region, Cotabato has the highest number of farms with 126,700 covering 275,500 hectares of agricultural land. The total farms for the province accounted for 38.3% of the total farms in the region. Areas under agricultural land comprised 42% of the total land area of the province.

Cotabato is considered Mindanao's food basket. It is a major producer of cereals, tropical fruits, vegetables, sugarcane, coconut, coffee, freshwater fish, and livestock. It is also one of the country's leading producers of raw and semi-processed rubber, with markets in Asia and Europe, and industrial trees.

For the livestock sector, the province primarily produces chicken, hogs, ducks, goats, carabaos, and cows. According to the 2019

data of PSA, carabao has the highest number of inventory under ruminants with 68,965 and 2,465,146 inventory of chicken for poultry.

POVERTY PROFILE

From being one of the poorest provinces of the Philippines back in 2012 with a poverty incidence rate of 44.8% among families, it is now at the 16th spot with 33.5% among families based on the 2015 PSA poverty statistics report.

In terms of the poverty incidence situation in Cotabato, the municipality of Pikit has the highest poverty incidence while the City of Kidapawan has the lowest.



BACKGROUND

Malinao is a barangay in the municipality of Banisilan, in the province of Cotabato. Its population as determined by the 2015 Census was 4,268. This represented 9.77% of the total population of Banisilan.

Most of the residents in the said barangay are into farming of corn and *palay*. It is usually the source of the income and food of their family.

Like most farmers in the country, the income that they earned is not enough to provide their family needs, given the geographical structure of the area and problems in transportation.

ABOUT SAMAHAN NG MAGSASAKA SA MALINAO

The Samahan ng Magsasaka sa Malinao in Brgy. Malinao, Banisilan is a beneficiary of the SAAD Program in 2019. The group with 59 members was also founded by the program in the late part of 2019. It was registered with the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) in December of the same year.

Before SAAD Program, members were planting corn and palay with an income ranging from Php 3,000.00 to Php 6,000.00 a month.

Forty-eight-year-old Wilson Aniero or "Tatay Wilson" is a member of the association. Farming and raising chicken are his sources of income for his family since childhood.

However, financial problems caused difficulties in Tatay Wilson's farming and chicken-raising. He did not have enough money to buy feeds and chicken cages.

The program also conducted a technical training for Chicken Egg Management, which aims to equip the association on the proper methods of egg production as well as to prepare beneficiaries in managing the interventions they received.

Tatay Wilson is leading the day-to-day management of the poultry. The association also made rotation schedules and assigned laborer or what they call "bayani", who is being paid to clean and monitor the farm frequently as well as feed the chickens.

To cut costs, the association integrates commercial feeds with any available local produce like corn, grated coconut, malunggay leaves, and other local grasses.

The group also conducts weekly and monthly meetings to discuss financial reports. They also allocate savings which they deposit in bank.

Tatay Wilson is optimistic that with good management and favorable weather conditions, their project will surely alleviate their economic condition.





From December 2019 to June 2020, the group harvested 17,792 eggs and generated an income of Php 174,548.00, which was utilized to provide financial assistance to its members to cope up with the pandemic.

A tray of 30 table eggs was sold at Php 160.00 within their municipality. Some members were encouraged to do online selling of cakes and other foods, wherein eggs are the main ingredients.

The association earned more profit during the pandemic since eggs were in demand as they were a cheaper commodity. They generated income of about Php 1,600.00 per day or Php 13,000 monthly net income, excluding salaries of caretakers and maintenance expenses like vitamins.

Tatay Wilson said that his co-farmers were very glad for the opportunity they received from the SAAD Program as it helped them provide their families' necessities as well as elevate their financial status.

PLANS

Tatay Wilson said they are planning to buy more chicken to generate more income.

The association is also helping their fellow farmers in their community so that they could learn skills and farming methods from the SAAD training.





SULTANKUDARAT

PHYSICAL PROFILE

Sultan Kudarat is composed of 12 municipalities and one city. It is situated between the provinces of Maguindanao and Cotabato on the north and South Cotabato and Sarangani on the south.

The soil topography of the province ranges from plain and rolling to hilly and mountainous. The coastal towns of Lebak, Kalamansig, and Palembang on the western side are lined by mountain ranges that wall the central portion of the province from the sea. The province's total land area is 5,298.34 km².

Its soils are favorable for the cultivation of all kinds of crops, especially for rice and corn. The climate in the province is characterized by a short dry season of one to three months while the rainfall is evenly distributed throughout the year. The province is considered free from typhoons.

AGRICULTURE PROFILE

The province's economic activity is agriculture. The leading crops produced in the province are rice, corn, coconut, coffee, banana, mango, durian, and African palm. In terms of area, palay has the highest land area of 118,074 hectares with a total production of 430,996 metric tons of palay.

For the livestock sector, the province's inventory for swine is 67,784 while carabao is 65,575 in 2015. Also, the province's poultry population is 62,119 for native chicken and 729,524 for duck, which are commonly raised in the province.


POVERTY PROFILE

The poverty incidence rate among families in the province of Sultan Kudarat decreased 16.9% - from 41.2% in 2015 to 24.3% in 2018. This also means that a family of five must have an annual per capita poverty threshold of Php 23,775.00 to reach the basic and non-feed needs.

In terms of the poverty incidence situation in Sultan Kudarat, the municipality of Palimbang has the highest poverty incidence at 64.3% while the city of Tacurong has the lowest at 16.4% according to the data of 2015 PSA.

BACKGROUND

ROEL GABINES

UPLAND RICE PRODUCTION AND VEGETABLE PRODUCTION PROJECT

Brgy Salangsang, Lebak, Sultan Kudarat Php 23,250.00 Salangsang is a barangay in the municipality of Lebak, in the province of Sultan Kudarat. It's a far-flung area populated by Manobo and Tiruray people. They are highland dwellers, relatively nomadic in culture and lives mostly on the bounty of the forest. There is high illiteracy rate among the group, very few are educated and largely subsistent farmers.

The place is about 25 km away from the town proper and local transportation is difficult. It's usual to see people riding horses just to reach the town as road condition is hard and at times dangerous for motor vehicle. Livelihood is mainly agricultural with products such as coffee, corn, and wild honey.

Roel Gabines is a farmer and a father of three from the said area. Living with an extended family, his Php 10,000.00 monthly income from corn and upland rice farming is not enough to sustain the expenses of their basic needs, especially since he is paying for his son's college education.

Roel became a beneficiary of the SAAD Program in 2018. When SAAD arrived in the barangay, he and his neighbors actively participated and joined to the program. For him, SAAD will be the hope for his children's future.

The program implemented Php 1.37 million worth of Upland Rice and Vegetable Production Project for 88 farmers in the area.



PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION

In 2018, the Barangay Salangsang Farmers Association with a total of 212 beneficiaries benefited Php 7 million worth of upland rice seeds, vegetable seeds, upgraded Anglo Nubian goats, and mallard ducks. Roel got Php 23,250.00 worth of interventions.

During the implementation, Roel together with other beneficiaries underwent different social preparation and technical training for the upland rice and livestock production management. They were taught on the negative effects of "pagkakaingin", which is still prevalent in their area.

Roel received two upgraded Anglo Nubian goats, 7 mallard ducks, five packs vegetable seeds, and two upland rice seeds.

He applied the learnings on Animal Healthcare Management for his goats and ducks. He was able to breed properly and effectively manage the ducks' egg production without sacrificing the health of the animals. He created a schedule guide for his family to follow for the daily feeding, monitoring, cleaning of shed, and vitamins.

Aside of the goats and ducks, Roel managed the land preparation, planting, weeding, monitoring of the upland rice and backyard vegetables. He also applied the knowledge he gained from different SAAD's production training on rice and vegetable as well as crop protection and postharvest storage.



KEY RESULTS

Roel harvested 69 sacks from 2018 to 2020 with an earning of Php 41,600.00, which he used to put up a small *sari-sari* store and renovate his family's house.

The two sacks of upland rice seeds Roel received in 2018 was planted in 1 ha upland farm. He harvested 34 sacks, wherein 10% was allocated as seeds for the next cropping season, 40% for food consumption, and 50% for the market. He sold them at Php 1,600 per sack.

However, 2019 was not in his favor. Due to low palay seeds germination, insect infestation, and plant diseases, Roel only harvested 18 sacks. The low production in 2019 prompted him to not sell.

Meanwhile, 9 sacks were sold in 2020, two for next cropping, and the rest for food consumption.

On the other hand, Roel's goats multiplied from 2 to 6. He sold two for Php 3,000.00 each while four were left to breed.

As expected to have an instantaneous effect on the lives of the beneficiaries, we always ensure that SAAD projects reach the beneficiaries. Various training was also provided to them to improve their skills in project management.

A total of 2,293 farmers benefited from the program's livelihood production projects for upland rice, corn, vegetables, and livestock.

At present, distribution of inputs is ongoing while SAAD implementers already started teaching organizational development as well as training on post-harvest and market linkage to make the farming activity of the beneficiaries more profitable and sustainable.

PHYSICAL PROFILE

Maguindanao is a province in the Philippines located in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM). It is comprised of 36 municipalities, further subdivided into 508 barangays.

The province has a land area of 9,729.04 km² or 3,756.40 mi². Its population as determined by the 2015 Census was 1,173,933. Maguindanao is bordered, clockwise from the North, by Lanao del Sur, Cotabato, Sultan Kudarat, the Moro Gulf, and the Illana Bay.

AGRICULTURE PROFILE


Maguindanao land area is devoted to agriculture with 174,789 hectares based on PSA in 2002. The major crops in the province are rice, corn, mango, coconut, and banana.

According to the PSA, Maguindanao has 83,478 carabaos, 7,129 cattle, 11,765 swine, 10,008 goats, 131,544 chickens, and 77,681 ducks in 2019.

POVERTY PROFILE

According to the PSA in 2018, the province's poverty incidence among families is 40.6%, lower than its findings in 2015 at 45.5%.

A family with five members in the region must earn at least Php 8,985.00 on average monthly to sustain their daily nutritional subsistence and other non-food basic requirements stated by 2015 data of the PSA.





BACKGROUND

YOLLY SOCIAS

SAAD'S INTEGRATED SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD ASSISTANCE FOR MAGUINDANAO (ISLAM) PROJECT

Brgy Lower Dilag, Pandag, Maguindanao Php 70,730.00 Lower Dilag is an undeveloped area in the municipality of Pandag, Maguindanao. It has high population of Muslim. Similar to other far-flung areas, farming is the main livelihood. Upland rice, corn, and vegetable are the usual crops.

The area is located in the mountainous part of the province, which has poor access to farm-to-market roads.

The residents have to traverse steep slopes when bringing their farm products to the market. Some pay for a tricycle ride to minimize time and effort but need to pay Php 50.00 minimum fare to the municipality of Bulan.

Some farmers would also transport their palay, corn, and other heavy product through trucks with a minimum cost of Php 30.00 per sack.

Also given the geographical area of Lower Dilag, the barangay has no electricity. Locals would also usually encounter calamities such as flash floods.



ABOUT YOLLY SOCIAS

Farming is the source of income for the family of Yolly Socias, a 41-year-old farmer from the area.

Yolly and her husband, Warlito, earn Php 6,000.00 monthly from selling vegetables in the public market and labor farming.

One of the difficulties they encounter in farming is the procurement of seeds, fertilizers, and tools since their small income is just enough to provide for their daily needs and son's education.

In 2017, the SAAD Program came to their community looking for 25 people who deserve to be its beneficiaries. Fortunately, Yolly was selected.

PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION

Yolly is one of the beneficiaries who received interventions from SAAD's Integrated Sustainable Livelihood Assistance for Maguindanao (ISLAM) Project. It was derived from the concept of "APAT DAPAT", wherein beneficiaries receive a package of four commodities such as goat (upgraded breed), chicken (free-range native), mallard duck, and vegetables.

There were a total of 25 beneficiaries in the barangay who received a total of Php 1.4 million worth of interventions.

Each beneficiary received 25 mallard ducks – 22 female and three male, four bags of laying pellet feed, 25 free-range native chicken, five goats, five vegetable seeds with four foliar fertilizer and garden tools such as *bolo*, *pala*, rake eagle, and hand trowel.

Yolly together with other beneficiaries also underwent different technical and exposure training which aim to educate farmers on how to manage and sustain their livelihood.

She and her husband work hand-in-hand in feeding and monitoring of the goats. They also clean the shed and pastureland.

For the ducks and chicken, she created a schedule board for her family to follow. They are responsible for the feeding of the ducks and native chicken and cleaning of the shed. They also release the animals daily from the shed to the open area.

Yolly emphasized that because of the SAAD, the community was able to change their mindset in farming. They manage their produced crops and livestock while securing food on their own plates, sharing their blessings, and earning money.

The farmers were also encouraged to preserve their traditional practices but also used strategies they learned from SAAD training activities to improve their planting methods, such as making and using organic pesticide.

They obtained and practiced the technologies or process in Animal Healthcare Management conveyed by the SAAD Program for the breeding of goat and chicken and duck egg production.

KEY RESULTS

Yolly's goats turned from 5 to 16, which significantly helped her financially.

She sold one goat in September 2020, which she used to buy medicines for her sick husband. She also sold another two to help her brother in financing his wedding and her sister's educational expenses.

The vegetable seeds Yolly received were planted on her backyard. The harvest is primarily allocated for food consumption. If harvest is abundant, she would sell the vegetables to her sari-sari store or the public market. She would often earn Php 500.00 to Php 1,000.00 per day.

One of the unfortunate things Yolly experienced was the death of the 25 free-range native chicken and 19 mallard ducks due to flash floods which happened in 2018.

Yolly didn't lose hope despite the tragedy. She still practiced the learnings from the SAAD training. The 6 mallard ducks which survived in the calamity are producing 6 to 10 eggs per day. She sells them at Php 8.00 per egg.



PLANS

As a farmer, Yolly dreamed of having a vast farming area to plant crops like corn and rice. To achieve that, she plans to multiply her goats and ducks so she could earn more.


